CHELSEA HOSPITAL.

July 11, 1811.

THESE are, by Order of the Right Honourable the Lords and others, Commissioners for managing the Affairs of the Royal Hospital at Chel-

sea, to give Notice, That all Out Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, residing in London, or within Twenty-five Miles thereof, are required to appear personally and regimentally with their Instructions and Certificates of Admission at the Secretary's Office, in the said Hospital, on the respective Days, and in their different Classes, according to their several Rates of Pension, as undermentioned; when Attendance will be given from Nine o'Clock in the Morning until Three in the Afternoon, for the Payment of Half a Year's Pension in Advance, to Christmas next; with the Augmentation in Proportion to their Disability and Length of Service, according to His Majesty's late Regulations in their Favour.

On Monday, the 15th of July.

The Pensioners at 6d. per Day, from the different Regiments of Cavalry, Foot Guards, 1st Regiment of Foot, with the remaining Regiments or Corps.

On Tuesday, the 16th of July.

Those at 9d. per Day, from the several Regiments of Cavalry, Foot Guards, 1st Regiment of Foot, with the remaining Regiments or Corps.

On Wednesday, the 17th of July.

Those at 1s. per Day, from the different Regiments of Cavalry, Foot Guards, the 1st Regiment of Foot to the 50th inclusive.

On Thursday, the 18th of July.

Those at 1s. per Day, from the 51st Regiment of Foot, with all the remaining Regiments or Corps; also the Pensioners from any Regiment or Corps at 1s. 0½d. and 1s. 1d. per Day.

On Friday, the 19th of July.

The Pensioners at 1s. 1½d. 1s. 2d. 1s. 2½d. and 1s. 3d. per Day.

On Saturday, the 20th of July.

Those at 1s. 3½d. per Day, with those at the different Rates to 1s. 9d. per Day inclusive.

On Tuesday, the 23d of July.

The Pensioners from the Militia at 5d. per Day, with the Private Gentlemen who receive Annuities from the late 1st and 2d Troops of Horse Guards, with those Pensioners from the several Regiments who have been admitted on account of Blindness, whether at 1s. per Day or upwards, when the Hospital Surgeons will attend, for the Purpose of examining all such Men, and report to the next Board upon any of them who may appear to be recovered or improved in their Sight, the Payment of whose Pension is then to be suspended, till the further Order of the Board.

And that all Out Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, who live at a greater Distance than Twenty-five Miles from London, and those in Scotland and Ireland, are hereby required and commanded, after the 25th of December next, and after every succeeding 25th of June and 25th of December, until further Orders, to apply to one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in the Neighbourhood where they reside, and make the following Affidavit, which the said Magistrate for the County, City, Borough, or Riding, before whom the Pensioner appears, will sign and date, viz.

And such of them as were admitted on account of Blindness are ordered to transmit, with their Half-yearly Affidavits, a Certificate as to the State of their Sight, signed by an Army Surgeon, or other medical Person resident in their Neighbourhood; but in such distant Parts, where a medical Certificate is impracticable, a Certificate from the Minister of the Parish to that Fact, and to ascertain the Continuance of their Blindness, will be admitted.

The Affidavit, drawn according to the above Form, sworn before, dated and attested by a Magistrate, is to be put up in a Cover, and sent by the General Post, directed thus: "To the Right Hon. the Paymaster-General of His Majesty's Land Forces, London," marking on the Cover, "Chelsea Pensioners' Affidavit," and Counterparts or Duplicates of the said Affidavits are to be reserved by the Out Pensioners respectively, to be exhibited to such Persons as shall be directed to pay them, together with their Instructions and Certificates of Admission, in order that their Claim to the Out Pensions may be fully verified, and their Persons clearly identified.

And to the end that the Commissioners for the Affairs of Chelsea Hospital may be satisfied that the Pensioners are the same Persons who have passed their Examination, it is hereby further directed, that such of them who have served in, and have been discharged from, any of the Regiments, or Independent Companies of Invalids, or Royal Veteran Battalions, are not to mention in their Affidavits such Regiment or Company of Invalids, or Royal Veteran Battalions, in which they served last, but the Regiment, Troop, or Corps of the Army from which they were first discharged and recommended, and received at Chelsea Hospital.

The Pensioners are particularly to take Notice, that the Half-yearly Payments after Christmas are regulated, as to the Place of Payment, by the Musters at Chelsea, or the Affidavits sent as above, after the Midsummer preceding; and that the Midsummer Payment is in like Manner regulated by the Musters or Affidavits after the Christmas preceding.

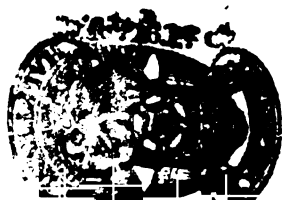
