### PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presenta-tion cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

SCHEDULE.

Every Licensed Pilot employed in piloting a vessel of upwards of one thousand eight hundred tons register to or from the port of Newport shall be paid (in addition to the pilotage rates fixed by the Bye-laws approved by the Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five) the additional pilotage rate of five shillings for every one hundred tons of the registered tonnage of the vessel above one thousand eight hundred tons, such additional pilotage rate to be paid in respect of the stage (in and out) known as the River's Mouth (viz. the stage from Newport to the River's Mouth and vice versâ).

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning "the burial of the dead in England beyond the "limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act "concerning the burial of the dead in the Metro-"polis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burialground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burialgrounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also that no

such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by another Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nincteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act further to amend the laws concerning " the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty - five, as affecting burials in the parish of Stanwell, should be varied, by substituting the following directions for those contained in the said Order, in regard to burials in the church and churchyard of that

parish, viz. :

That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Stanwell, in the county of Middlesex, and after the first of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, in the churchyard within thirty yards of any dwelling; and also in the rest of the churchyard except as follows:-

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the thirteenth day of March next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said thirteenth day of March. representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the "laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, "and to amend the Act concerning the burial " of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :-

BLAENAU FESTINIOG.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church and churchyard of St. David, Blaenau Festiniog, in the county of Merioneth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such represen-tation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the 13th day of March next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said 13th day of March.

HE following Statute, made by the Governing Body of Exeter College, Oxford, on the twenty-fifth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:

That in Statute II § 4 the words "The Rectorship shall be tenable for life" shall be struck out.

That in the same Statute and Clause after the words "not exceeding £500 a year for life" shall be inserted the words "At the age of seventy-five the Rector shall be entitled to retire on a pension of £500 a year for life, and shall retire, unless a majority of two-thirds of the Fellows present at a College Meeting specially summoned decide that his retirement would be prejudicial to the interests of the College. At any College meeting summoned to consider this question the Rector himself shall not be present, and the voting shall be by ballot. At the age of eighty the Rector shall in any case retire, and shall be entitled to a pension of £500 a year for life, and the Rectorship shall become vacant."

That in the same Statute and Clause after the words "corporate revenues of the College" shall be added the words "unless there shall be at the disposal of the College any special funds available

for the payment of this pension."

That in Statute III § 15 after the words · " further terms not exceeding five years" shall be added the words "After the age of sixty-five no Tutorial Fellow shall be re-elected except by the votes of a majority of two-thirds of those present at a College Meeting held for the purpose of deciding the question of his re-election; nor shall he in any case be re-elected after the age of seventy. But whenever a Tutorial Fellow shall

number of years to entitle him to a Pension, he shall if duly qualified for a Pension, either receive the Pension to which he is entitled under these Statutes, or, if there be not sufficient income from the Pension Fund for this purpose, continue to hold his Fellowship without discharging any duties as Tutor or Lecturer until the income of the Pension Fund shall be sufficient for the payment of his pension. Whenever the income of the Pension Fund shall be sufficient for this purpose his Fellowship shall at once become vacant.

That in the same Statute and Clause after the words "the question of his re-election" shall be added the words "at such College Meetings the

voting shall be by ballot."

That in Statute III § 27 after the words " or a Professorship" shall be inserted the words "in

this or any other University."

That in Statute IV § 5 after the words "to be a Fellow of the College" shall be added the words "No Tutorial Fellow shall retain a Tutorship after the age of sixty; but, so long as he holds his Tutorial Fellowship, he shall, subject to the provisions of these Statutes, hold the office of Lecturer, and shall perform such duties as are

assigned to him by the Educational Council."

That in Statute V § 2 at the end of the clause shall be added the words "It shall also be permissible for the College, if in the judgment of the Electors there be no candidate duly qualified for election to a Stapledon Scholarship, to decide that the Stapledon Scholarship or Scholarships then vacant shall be turned into an Exhibition or Exhibitions, not exceeding in value the value of the Scholarship or Scholarships then vacant. Such Exhibitions shall have the same limitations in respect of birth, place of education, and tenure, as the Stapledon Scholarships, but shall not be limited in respect of age."

That in Statute V § 3 for the words "further term of two years" be substituted the words "further term not exceeding two years."

That in the same Statute and Clause in place of the sentence beginning with the words "at the end of two years" and ending with the words "advisable so to do" be substituted the following sentence, viz., " At the expiration of any term for which a Scholar has been re-elected the Rector and Fellows may, if they think it advisable so to do, continue his Scholarship for a further term or terms, provided that every Scholar shall in any case vacate his Scholarship at the end of five years from his matriculation."

That in Statute V "King Charles the First's Trust" § 2 for the words " shall be eighty pounds" shall be substituted the words "shall not exceed

eighty pounds."

The College Seal was ordered to be affixed to the above Amendments at a meeting of the Rector and Fellows, being the Governing Body of the College, specially summoned, on the twenty-fifth day of January, 1895.
