PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

Be it known to all, that I, Arou Monachin, do hereby declare before the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of New York, that I do hereby file my petition for naturalization, and to make known to the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of New York:

The petition of Arou Monachin, hereby filed, respectfully shows:

First. My place of residence is 2589 Riverwood Drive, New York City, N. Y.

Second. My occupation is Diamond Importer.

Third. I was born on the 15 day of January, anno Domini 1879 at Toropoli, on or about the 3 day of February,

Fourth. I immigrated to the United States from Mogilev Russia on or about the 13 day of February,

anno Domini 1896, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 13 day of February,

anno Domini 1896, on the vessel Paul.

(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 15 day of January, anno Domini 1899 at New York City, in the Southern District Court of the United States.

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Judith; she was born on the 1 day of May, anno Domini 1877 at Russia, and now resides at with me.

I have 2 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Russia or any independent State, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the sum of 10 years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 13 day of January, anno Domini 1896, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 13 day of January, anno Domini 1896, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. I made petition for citizenship to the Court of, on the day of, anno Domini 1899, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit:

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
