or loud. Children need to progress along a developmental path that leads from reflex to reflective problem solving. Using traditional games is one way to guide children from "the inattentive dispersion of mind" toward an ability to reason and choose. Board games provide an alternative to the high-tech, fast-paced video games.

While video games reinforce reflex, board games encourage reflective reasoning.

While video games require little personal contact, traditional games promote social interaction. I have woven a love of games into my practice as a child psychiatrist. I learn a lot by watching how a child plays a game. I observe if the

child has the discipline necessary to complete a game and to abide by the rules. I look at the child's face to notice if there is an expression of concentration or of boredom.

I watch if the child plays carelessly or thoughtfully. I assess whether the child learns from experience — or repeats mistakes. Does the child accept my offer of help and instruction?

Is the child patient and observant when it is

my turn to move? Does the child tolerate losing and find satisfaction in winning?

When I play a game with a child, I am not there to win or to lose. My role is to coach. I try to motivate, to encourage, to model and to instruct.

I suggest that when you play games with your child, you too, become a coach. The goal is not to win or to lose, but to prepare your child to venture into the world better skilled and

prepared to handle life's challenges. The goal is to guide your child from impulsive to choosing, from reflexive to reflective.
