Park's focus will be recruiting more top tech talent like <u>Mikey Dickerson</u> into government and identifying innovative ways to improve the quality of government digital services, two central goals of the President's <u>Smarter IT Delivery agenda</u>. He will also help ensure that the Administration has an on-the-ground sense of how technology is evolving and can craft policy and initiatives accordingly.
