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26 **BIOGRAPHY:** Kevin Shipp was one of
27 the most widely experienced
28 officers in the C.I.A., occupying
29 positions as an Agent on the
30 Protective Detail of the Director
31 and Deputy Director of the C.I.A., a manager of ongoing operations, an
32 internal Security Officer, a Counterintelligence investigator tasked to

1 ferret moles out of the C.I.A., a Counter Terrorism Center officer, a
2 protective operations team leader and a polygraph examiner.

3 On August 27, 2013, Shipp published "From the Company of Shadows".
4 Ascent Publications (2013). He provides a virtual encyclopedia of
5 internal and external US intelligence and C.I.A. operations; included
6 for the first time in a single volume revealed to the public. He
7 details several operations he was involved in, giving the reader an
8 insider's view of what a C.I.A. officer actually does. He describes
9 the important functions of the C.I.A., its successes and removes the
10 veil covering C.I.A. abuses done under the guise of secrecy. This is
11 an account every American should read.

13 [OPENING REMARKS]

14

[RESUME]

15

16 I always like to start out by saying I'm a recovering
17 C.I.A. officer, for all of you here this morning. I do go to
18 weekly meetings: Agency Anonymous. So I'm getting there.

19 I was a decorated C.I.A. officer. Part of that is in the
20 book which we fought to get out. Initially, they told me I could
21 never say I worked there. We fought them and we beat them on
22 that one, and we got some things in the book, eventually.

23 I went on deadly assignments for my Agency and my country.
24 I love my country. I was very dedicated to the Agency.

25 Some of those assignments they told us we may not come back
26 from. No problem. That's what we did.

3 [C.I.A.: ILLEGAL, UNCONSTITUTIONAL, CRIMINAL]

4

5 But the higher I got up in the Agency, the more I began to
 6 see illegal, unconstitutional, sometimes criminal activity that
 7 the Agency, and some other sectors of the shadow government, I
 8 call it were doing things that were illegal and
 9 unconstitutional.

10

11 [U.S. CONSTITUTION IS SUPREME, OVER THE C.I.A.]

12

13 And, I always have to say this: the United States
 14 Constitution is the supreme law of the land. It supersedes every
 15 other law in the US criminal justice system and the judicial
 16 branch.

17 That's worth remembering. When the US government violates
 18 the Constitution, they are committing multiple felonies based on
 19 the foundation of our government. We must always remember that.

1

2 [FEDERAL AGENTS PLEDGE TO THE CONSTITUTION FIRST]

3

4 So, as a federal agent I had to swear an oath to the
5 Constitution, to defend the Constitution and our country against
6 enemies foreign and domestic.

7 The problem was there were some that were domestic. And,
8 there were some that happened to be in our own government. So, I
9 had to make a decision. Was I going to uphold my oath to the
10 Constitution, or was I going to shrink back? And, for me there,
11 it was an easy choice. I chose to stand for the Constitution and
12 that's why I'm here this evening.

13 [APPLAUSE]

14 [WHILE YOU WORKED, THE C.I.A. PLAYED]

15 We have to. If, it's because we have been so busy with our
16 lives, just trying to survive, that they've been able to get
17 away with doing what they've done.

18

19 [WAKE UP CALL]

20

21 This is a wake-up call. This is an alert. This whole
22 conference, and the one that's subsequently going to come after
23 this, is a wake-up call.

24

25 [POST CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT]

26

27 It is almost too late to stop what is now a post-
28 constitutional government.

29 The People are no longer ruling in our country.

30 The government in a tyrannical form is now ruling the
31 people by subversion, force and fear.

32 Sadly that's what we have today.

1 The reason I am here, is, the question is always asked,
2 where are the whistleblowers?

3 If there is a covert geo engineering program, why aren't
4 people coming out and blowing the whistle on it if it's so
5 dangerous?

6

7 [NSA SPIES STORE DATA ON YOU, NOT TERRORISTS]

8

9 The NSA surveillance program, if it wasn't for Edward
10 Snowden, who both the Democratic and Republican Party have come
11 out publicly and said they want him assassinated, if it wasn't
12 for Edward Snowden would we know about the NSA spying program
13 that is collecting 1.5 billion pieces of information on you and
14 me, and our telephones, and our Internet, Internet
15 communications, our emails?

16 That's what they were doing, not on terrorists, on us. And,
17 they were storing it in the Utah Data Center which is still
18 there, forever.

19 So, if there's something you do later on that they're not
20 real happy with, they've got your emails, your texts, your cell
21 phone conversations, and everything is still stored in the
22 database. And, all that stuff, by the way, is still there on
23 you, not on terrorists. Every single American citizen.

24 So this is what we have here.

25 We have a government that is functioning outside the
26 Constitution. This is the size of the secret government.

27 [POINTS TO POWERPOINT, SEE ABOVE]

28

1 [SHADOW GOVERNMENT]

2 [DEEP STATE]

3

4 I call it the shadow government. There are some people who
5 call it the Deep State. Take your pick, same thing.

6 We've got the C.I.A. functions covert programs. They're
7 probably the most out of control because their Charter is so
8 loose.

9 The IRS has covert programs.

10 FBI.

11 Department of Defense.

12 Department of Homeland Security.

13 Department of State.

14 Department of Justice.

15 The NSA.

16 And, I have added the National Weather Service and NOAA
17 because as Dane [Wigington] I think told you, the National
18 Weather Service and NOAA are now binding their employees with
19 secrecy agreements so they cannot talk without penalty of prison
20 about some of these climate programs that they're doing.

21 That's called a red flag.

22 That's what we're facing.

23 Here is the first whistleblower, John F. Kennedy

24 [POWERPOINT SLIDE SHOWING JFK PHOTO AND QUOTES]

25

26 [JFK: SECRECY IS REPUGNANT]

27

28 "The very word secrecy is repugnant in a free and open
29 society." One of the greatest speeches ever given in terms of
30 the Constitution.

31 "And there is a very grave danger that an announced need
32 for increased security will be seized upon by those anxious to

1 expand its meaning to the very limits of offi C.I.A.l censorship
2 and concealment."

3 That was a prophetic message by John F. Kennedy, April 27,
4 1961.

5 We all know what happened to him in 1963 don't we?

6

7 [JFK PLANNED TO DISMANTLE THE C.I.A.]

8

9 They had identified, John F. Kennedy and Robert, had
10 identified Mafia connections within the C.I.A.. There was an
11 assassination program.

12 They engaged in the Bay of Pigs without his knowledge. He
13 had come out publicly and said he was going to break the C.I.A.
14 into a thousand pieces and dismantle it. And then, in 1963 we
15 saw what happened.

16

17 [9/11]

18

19 9/11, we don't have time to go into that. I just want to
20 say this. I teach criminal investigations at a university.

21 9/11 was immediately labeled a terrorist event, and there
22 was a reason for that.

23 When you label it a terrorist event it stops any sort of
24 criminal investigation right in his tracks.

25 If they would have done a criminal investigation of 9/11 it
26 would have uncovered things that would have painted a whole
27 different picture about why those buildings came down.

28 I would encourage you to go to Architects and Engineers for
29 Truth [<http://www.ae911truth.org/>] have done an outstanding
30 video about Tower Seven.

31 Tower Seven was not hit by a plane and it came down under
32 controlled detonation. Now I'm a former C.I.A. analyst, and I'm

1 saying that based on a whole lot of research that was not done
2 by a plane.

3 And, just finally, when the towers came down hundreds of
4 tons of metal, steel, marble and concrete turned to dust before
5 it hit the ground, so much so that there was almost no seismic
6 activity when the buildings hit the ground.

7 It was all dust. You can see steel girders as they come
8 down, if you, any of you, have seen that, literally vaporize and
9 turn to dust as they fall down.

10 That is not natural. All we're going to say there. I
11 recommend you look into a criminal investigation of 9/11 and get
12 past the terrorist narrative, which has been a favorite one for
13 decades.

14 [POWERPOINT SLIDE TITLED "WHERE ARE THE WHISLEBLOWERS?"]

15

16 [WHERE ARE THE WHISTLEBLOWERS?]

17

18 Where are the whistleblowers? I come from the belly of the
19 beast. I was an interviewer, interrogator. I was a
20 counterintelligence agent. I was a polygraph examiner. I was an
21 internal investigator, and on and on and on. So I know this
22 system, and I know it well, and then I experienced it
23 personally.

24 Why don't people come out in these secret programs that
25 they know are illegal and unconstitutional?

26 Why don't they come out and blow the whistle and tell
27 people what's going on?

28 Well, this is why.

29

1 [C.I.A. SECRECY AGREEMENT: MUZZLES WHISTLEBLOWERS]

2

3 The US government, every secret operational program that it
4 has, forces the employee, or coerces the employee, the person,
5 into signing what is called a secrecy agreement, non-disclosure
6 agreement.

7 Now, back in the original days, the secrecy agreement was
8 created to protect legitimate sources and methods. Military
9 technology and things like that. That was okay, that was fine.

10 The secrecy agreement protected us when we went out in the
11 field, because if they found out who we were we wouldn't just be
12 killed, we would have been tortured.

13 So, it protected our identities.

14 It protects the identities of troops in the field doing
15 movements out during wartime. That's how it started. But, it's
16 been taken and it's been turned into a monster where the secrecy
17 agreement is now being used as the ultimate tool of
18 intimidation.

19 Every employee that gets a job and obtains knowledge of
20 these covert programs, the Air Force Geo Engineering Program, in
21 my opinion, has to sign this agreement.

22

23 [SECRECY AGREEMENT: THREATS AND INTIMIDATION]

24

25 What the agreement says is if you disclose anything that
26 you know about this program, you can be terminated, or you can
27 force criminal penalties, in other words, you can be put in
28 prison.

29 A good friend, we hope will be speaking at our next event,
30 was put in prison by the C.I.A. for two years. He exposed the
31 torture program which was a lot more than waterboarding folks.

1 As a matter of fact, they got almost nothing out of
2 waterboarding. People died. It was, it was bad.

3

4 [C.I.A. HERO WHISTLEBLOWER ON TORTURE: JOHN KIRIAKOU]

5

6 Anyway, he came out publicly, talked about the torture
7 program, made mistake, one wrong word, and was convicted - John
8 Kiriakou - and they put him in prison for two years.
9 Modern day hero. Just got out. Serviced two years for coming out
10 and trying to alert people about what was going on.

11 I was talking to somebody in the back. I have to watch
12 every single word I say because they are just waiting for one
13 thing. And so, it's a constant screen. You don't want to give
14 them any ammunition to put in their in their gun.

15 So, there are binding power penalties and threats for the
16 secrecy agreement. That stops ninety-nine percent of the people
17 right there. Oh man, I'm not going there. I'll just look the
18 other way. Uh uh, I don't want to go to jail. I don't want to
19 lose my job. I don't want my life destroyed.

20

21 [CONGRESS CANNOT CONTROL THE C.I.A. SHADOW GOVERNMENT]

22

23 Now, there is a massive, mammoth complex secret mechanism
24 in the US government. It's called the intelligence community. It
25 is so powerful that not even the Congress or the Senate can
26 control it.

27 Matter of fact, it controls them. It does whatever it
28 wants. They have these Senate investigations, and they'll come
29 and they say, sorry Senator, we can't tell you what we're doing
30 because you don't have the Agency clearance. And that's where
31 it's shut down.

1 Benghazi is an example. The NSA surveillance program is an
2 example. Where did those go? Nowhere.

3 I sit on the Citizens' Commission on Benghazi and that's a
4 whole, another story, maybe the next conference.

5

6 [ORIGIN OF THE C.I.A. SECRECY AGREEMENT (1948)]

7

8 Anyway, began in 1948, I talk about this in the book. Real
9 quickly, an Air Force B-2 bomber had four RCA civilian engineers
10 on board. The plane went down in a horrible accident. A couple
11 of the pilots parachute out, parachuted out. All four engineers
12 were killed in a horrible crash.

13 The widows of the engineers demanded to know from the Air
14 Force why the plane crashed and why their husbands died.

15 The Air Force came back and said, well we can't tell you
16 that because it's secret. Turns out it was gross negligence on
17 behalf of the pilot. Drove the plane into the ground. Hit the
18 wrong flaps. Hit the thruster instead of the opposite and
19 literally drove that bomber right into the farm. I've been to
20 the site. I have pictures of it in the book.

21 So, the families pushed it and said, no, no, it wasn't
22 classified. You can't do that. We're suing you for the death of
23 our husbands. So, the United States government, the Executive
24 Branch, created what's called the State's Secrets privilege.

25

26 [STATE SECRETS PRIVILEGE - EXCUSE TO HIDE ANYTHING]

27

28 The State Secrets Privilege was literally, the wording was
29 derived, from the monarchy of the King of England which gave the
30 King of England absolute power to shut down any case they deemed
31 was unacceptable, to shut it down.

1 The State Secrets Privilege was used to shut down these
2 four widows' case. It was shut down. It was sealed in federal
3 court so that no one, including Congress the Senate and their
4 attorneys, would ever see it. That's where this all began, in
5 1948.

6 And it's gotten far worse from there.

7

8 [SECURITY AGREEMENT: LEGAL SLAVERY; WAIVES BASIC RIGHTS]

9

10 People who sign this binding secrecy agreement, which I
11 have signed several of and several compartments as well, they
12 don't, they are not told, and they do not know, that when they
13 sign that agreement they are giving up all of their
14 constitutional rights.

15 They have no right to trial.

16 They have no right to a jury trial.

17 They have no right to sue the government if they are
18 exposed to toxins and made sick, or their family or anyone else.

19 They have lost all their rights to due process. They're not
20 told that.

21 I found that out the hard way when I tried to sue the
22 government and they came back and said, Sorry Pal, you don't
23 have any rights. So, I took a different course which I'll tell
24 you about here in a moment.

25 So, that's how they shut them up to. There is within the
26 federal, each federal agency, now remember, since 1948 this
27 procedure has been perfected.

28

29 [SCIENCE TO DESTROY WHISTLEBLOWERS]

30

31 It is a science to destroy a whistleblower from the very
32 beginning. They come to a supervisor. They may even have the

1 courage to call their Congressman or Senator about this illegal
2 operation.

3

4 [BUREAUCRATIC PUNISHMENTS]

5

6 And the first thing that happens is they start getting
7 promotions denied, even though their top performers.
8 Their promotions are denied. They're given embarrassing
9 assignments where they put in the corner of a building
10 somewhere, so that everybody knows that they're being penalized
11 for this. If they continue to blow the whistle and push push it
12 even farther, they'll do things like this. I have seen this
13 personally.

14 They'll raise the interest rates on the credit union loans
15 so that their cars other loans are unaffordable.

16 If they try to pull out their retirement funds to provide
17 for their family, and especially in the case where they've been
18 driven out of the organization, the organization will block
19 their retirement funds so that the family will be destroyed
20 financially.

21 Now that is a felony, for a federal agency to deny the
22 retirement funds of an employee is a felony.

23 I've seen them do that. It was an interesting, interesting
24 case. They will do that.

25 Now, another thing that they will do, just so you all know
26 this, I want the public to know this too.

27

28 [FALSIFIED PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTS AS WEAPONS]

29

30 What they'll do is they'll say okay, we can see that you're
31 very stressed out by all this and we want to help you. So, we're
32 going to refer you to the office of medical services so you can

1 undergo some psychological counseling to help you sleep at night
2 and make you better and get rid of your anxiety. So, we're going
3 to set up an appointment for you to meet with a psychologist.

4 Now where do you suppose that goes? The interview is over.
5 The document is falsified. The employee is paranoid, obsessive-
6 compulsive and disgruntled. That goes in the file, so if it ever
7 does get to the Congress or Senate or court, they pull it out
8 and say, well look, he or she went under an evaluation and
9 they're basically unstable, end of story. Shut the case down.
10 Part of an intentional process.

11

12 [INSPECTORS GENERAL ARE OFTEN SHADOW GOVERNMENT SOLDIERS]

13

14 It is a campaign, I, Inspector General's, you guys, you
15 know that every federal agency has an IG, an inspector general,
16 right? They're created, supposedly, to oversee that agency and
17 keep it out of criminal activity, right?

18 Well, wrong. A lot of Inspector General's, I have to give
19 some kudos to the State IG because they helped me expose one
20 particular operation.

21 My agency's IG, I submitted a 15-page complex documented
22 report documenting my family was exposed to toxins, my wife was
23 bleeding out of her gums, she was bruising all over her body,
24 she lost a short term memory, she was on morphine because of
25 severe headaches because of the toxins they didn't want people
26 to know about that she was being exposed to. That's what they
27 didn't want people to know.

28 So, I submitted this document to the IG. Look, I did secret
29 tests. I ran samples out to certain reputable universities. I
30 secretly flew my son out for medical valuation with a well-known
31 immunologist. I got it all back, put her all together, went into

1 their desk, laid it on there and said, tell me there's no toxins
2 on this base.

3 So, they got the IG involved. We go into the big meeting
4 with the IG, and I said bring out my investigation, my report.
5 Well we don't know where it is. Now I've been told by other
6 officers that the roof was being raised off headquarters because
7 of this case. Reporters were calling from all over the place
8 trying to get information. They, headquarters was freaking out.
9 They knew darn well what this case is.

10 So, I pressed them, I had my two courageous attorneys
11 there, Clint Blackman and George Hardy, and I always say that,
12 God bless you guys, I love you. Man, they had they had courage
13 and I hope someday they get the credit for that.

14

15 [PUNISHMENT: THE BUREAUCRATIC BRUSH OFF]

16

17 But, we got the IG finally to pull out my investigative
18 report that had all this evidence in it. What did we get? We got
19 a one-page document written in someone else's handwriting that
20 said that there was no problem at all and their investigation
21 had revealed nothing.

22 So, are IGs always objective and honest, if they have
23 interest in that organization? I can tell you right now, no.
24 Should be, but they're not.

25

26 [CULTURE OF FEAR]

27

28 Within, because of all of this, within these federal
29 agencies, the NSA, the C.I.A., the DIA, any agency that in
30 especially the covert agencies that engage in nefarious
31 operational programs, there is a culture of fear.

1 You guys out there that still work there know what I'm
2 talking about.

3

4 [PARANOIA PALACE]

5

6 Everyone, I used to call it the Paranoia Palace.

7 Everybody inside there is afraid of saying anything,
8 because they know about this system.

9 They will destroy you.

10 They'll destroy your career.

11 They'll destroy your finances.

12 They'll destroy your family.

13 They'll take you all the way down as far as they can, even
14 from the outside.

15 You remember Gary Webb, who exposed the C.I.A. drug-
16 running operation down in Central America? Anybody know about
17 that out there?

18 Gary Webb eventually was driven to suicide. Remember that?
19 Did anybody see the movie. Yeah, yeah, see the movie? They
20 destroyed his career, his reputation, his life, his family, and
21 then he was found dead of a gunshot wound in a hotel room. The
22 perfect crime. Drive him to suicide, and there's no culpability,
23 and your problem is gone.

24 Frank Olson, jumped out of the C.I.A. LSD program. Jumped
25 out of the, think it was sixth story window of a hotel room.
26 Committed suicide because he had found out that the C.I.A. was
27 drugging people with LSD without their knowledge. What a
28 coincidence, Frank commits suicide.

29 John F. Kennedy, again, how far will they go? Will they go
30 that far? I think I think we all know the answer to that, and in
31 the constitutional government that's alarming at the very least.

1 Now, they tell us, well, 2012, the Congress and Senate came
2 out with, we're going to take care of this whistleblowers being
3 at risk in their lives being destroyed, their careers being
4 destroyed.

5

6 [SECURITY AGREEMENT SIGNERS ARE EXEMPTED FROM PROTECTION BY THE
7 WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION ACT (2012)]

8

9 So, we're going to pass the 2012 Whistleblower Protection
10 Act allowing any whistleblower that sees any illegal activity on
11 the part of the government, we're going to protect them so they
12 can come out and report it.

13 Sounds good, doesn't it? Sounds like a good thing.

14 What they don't tell you is if you read down through the
15 Act, anybody that has signed a secrecy agreement, is involved in
16 any covert government program, or handles anything classified,
17 is not covered by The Whistleblower Protection Act.

18 They have no protection. They are 100% at risk. And, there
19 are some that have come out thinking they were protected by this
20 and they were not, and they were penalized. That's the whole
21 idea.

22 This, I talked about the State Secrets Privilege. These
23 cases are sealed and no one can see them forever, once they're
24 sealed in court.

25 And, this was kind of the most disconcerting for me. There
26 are certain major newspapers, which if I mentioned their name
27 you would know them. These are national papers that are
28 communicating and directly connected in this case to the C.I.A.
29 and in some cases to the NSA.

30

1 [MAINSTREAM MEDIA COLLUDES WITH DEEP STATE]

2

3 So, if a whistleblower decides, I'm freedom of the press
4 man, you know, I'm going to the press and I'm going to report to
5 the press this illegal stuff that I've seen.

6 So they call up XYZ national newspaper, and if you do a
7 check you'll find out who that is, I want to tell you my story I
8 want to tell you what I've seen.

9 In this case, the reporter got right on the phone,
10 contacted the C.I.A., and told them what this person had just
11 reported for the story. That has been done several times with
12 this paper. They communicate with the C.I.A. regularly
13 regarding what they're going to publish and what they're not
14 going to publish. Chilling.

15 ["SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT]

16 I call this massive structure the shadow government.
17 Another fella calls it the Deep State. Take your pick, but I
18 want to show you how massive this secret government is.

19 Now this is since 9/11. I can tell you a lot of this was
20 pre-existing 9/11.

21 Most people think that the NSA surveillance program was a
22 result of 9/11. Isn't that what you've been told?

23 The NSA surveillance program existed before 9/11 happened.
24 That's what they're not telling you.

25 [READING 1ST "SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT BULLET POINT]

26 "1,271 government organizations involved in secrecy within
27 the United States.

28 [READING 2ND "SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT BULLET POINT]

29 "1931 private companies," large private companies, involved
30 in secrecy in the United States, bound by the secrecy agreement

1 [READING 3RD POWERPOINT BULLET POINT]

2 "10,000 intelligence locations across the United States"
3 did you get that? 10,000 secret locations, not overseas, not in
4 China, not in Indonesia, not in the, inside the United States.

5 Now the C.I.A. legally is only supposed to have a foreign
6 charter. Anybody know that? It was forbidden from having any
7 operations within the United States. That was its restraint.
8 That restraint is now gone. 10,000 locations.

9 [READING 4TH "SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT BULLET POINT]

10 "4.8 million Americans [and that's all that's just the ones
11 we know of] Hold government security clearances" and are bound
12 by and threatened by the secrecy agreement to stay silent.
13 Now the figure is a lot bigger than that, but that's a lot of
14 people, and their families, and everybody that they're connected
15 to. Do you think they're going to speak up if it means total
16 destruction? Probably not.

17 [READING 5TH "SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT BULLET POINT]

18 "854,000 people hold top secret security clearances" which
19 have severe penalties, and there's compartments above that, some
20 of which I had, that have even stricter penalties. But, that is
21 the number of people that have top-secret security clearances,
22 where they've got the keys to the kingdom, essentially.

23

24 [SECRECY AGREEMENT NOW TOOL TO SILENCE DISSENT]

25

26 Each one of these agencies' employees, the secrecy
27 agreement is a binding tool. Now it used to be to protect
28 legitimate classified information. It has morphed into a
29 threatening tool to silence dissent.

30 Of course, the C.I.A., the NSA, the FDA, the FBI, the
31 Department of State, Department of Justice, Department of
32 Defense, Department of State, and now we know that NOAA and the

1 National Weather Service are binding their employees with
2 secrecy agreements.

3

4 [NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE
5 SILENCES EMPLOYEES WITH
6 SECRECY AGREEMENT]

7

8 Why is the weather so secret? Got to ask that, don't you?
9 Maybe Dane [Wigington]'s right? Why do they have to bind people
10 like that? I am a huge proponent of the truth, and I am really,
11 really against secrecy in a constitutional government, unless
12 it's absolutely necessary.

13 Why would the National Weather Service make up a weather
14 program secret and make people sign a non-disclosure form? Got
15 to ask that question.

16 [READING 6TH "SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT BULLET POINT]

17

18 [TENS OF THOUSANDS OF GOVERNMENT CONTRACTORS]

19

20 The Military-Industrial Complex - tens of thousands of
21 government contractors. The government comes, for example, most
22 people don't know this.

23

24 [C.I.A. IN-Q-TEL CONTRACTOR MUZZLING TOOL]

25

26 The C.I.A. has a technical firm it's created called In-Q-
27 Tel. In-Q-Tel offered, I think a \$5 million contract to Google.

28 Now, what they do is they come to these companies and they
29 say, hey we got, will give you, a contract for \$5 million, \$20
30 million dollars, and most companies are thirsty, and they're out
31 trying to get contracts to survive.

1 So, they'll say, oh but you will take the, hey, we'll take
2 the contract.

3

4 [GOOGLE COLLUSION IS PROTECTED
5 BY THE SECRECY AGREEMENT]

6

7 Google took the contract, \$5 million contract. They are now
8 joined with the C.I.A. In-Q-Tel. What are they doing? They're
9 doing research on trends on the Internet and Facebook.

10 They're monitoring the Internet is what they're doing. Let
11 me just, let me just break that down for you.

12 Now do you think any of the Google executives can talk
13 about the program?

14 Do you think maybe they made them sign an agreement before
15 they got the \$5 million? Ah yeah.

16 Why don't you hear anything about that? Why doesn't Google
17 say anything about that? Well that's why.

18

19 [C.I.A CONTRACTORS ARE GAGGED]

20

21 Employees at every level, if you've got big time Beltway
22 Bandit government contractor X, that gets a covert Agency
23 contract, they are bound to sign the secrecy agreement, and
24 every employee at every level on that contract has to sign the
25 agreement.

26 Secretaries, the logistics people, of course the CEOs,
27 people that run the copy machines, all bound by the secrecy
28 agreement, thousands and thousands of people.

29 You see the number of people that are that are bound by the
30 government out there, are you kind of getting that picture? It's
31 a lot, and that's just the ones that we know.

32 ["SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT]

1 Here's a good quote: "The top secret world of government
2 created in response to the terrorist attacks of September 11,
3 2001 has become so large, so unwieldy, and so secretive that no
4 one knows how much money it costs, how many people it employs,
5 how many programs exist within it, or exactly how many agencies
6 do the same work"

7 ["SHADOW GOVERNMENT" POWERPOINT BULLET ONE]

8 And then, I italicize the next one: "Not even Congress
9 knows the size and the extent" of this intelligence secret
10 apparatus. That's why I call it the shadow government.

11 They don't even know how big it is. They don't even know a
12 lot of things that the C.I.A. especially, and others, are even
13 engaged in overseas. Syria is a prime example this is.

15 This is "A separate secret government that operates" and
16 this is the part that really gets to me it "Operates outside the
17 Constitution"

18 We are now in a post constitutional government. It's over
19 as far as the Constitution goes.

20 That's why I'm here. Some of us want to bring that back.
21 The only way to do it is to stand up against this. There's risk
22 involved, but we have to do it. Because, if we don't, we're
23 going down.

24 [APPLAUSE]

26 "Have we created a monster?"

27 My gosh, if you knew the size and extent, its, yes we have.
28 It's shocking.

29 Now, Dane [Wigington] played this and I want to emphasize
30 this because this is more than a smoking gun.

31

3
4 When the director of the C.I.A. comes out, anybody know
5 anything about the Council on Foreign Relations? Uh-huh, so you

9 speech, every word is refined, winnowed down, and everything he
10 says means something, everything.

13 "Another example is the array of technologies often refer
14 to collectively as geoengineering [kudos to Dane [Wigington],

18 the personal attention of the director of the C.I.A., that

4

5 [VACINNATIONS, CDC COVER-UP AND EXPLOSION OF AUTISM]

6

7 The Vax people are going to do such a much better job in
8 this, but I just want to mention it because I hate cover-ups.
9 Because I lived one, personally, and that's what's happening
10 with the vaccine-autism connection in the big way.

11 It [is] covering up the truth at the expense of young
12 children and their health, and the families that are ruined
13 because of this.

14 So you want to know the connection between autism and
15 vaccines? You know who the first people to ask are? The parents,
16 the ones who saw their child's behavior before the vaccine, and
17 what happened after the vaccine.

18 One of the doctors on Vax said that that real medicine is
19 an art where you listen to the patient and you watch. That is

11

14

15 Put your reputation down and come out and stand with these
16 people and have the guts and the courage to support your
17 Constitution.

18 Because if you don't, we've got maybe half a decade at most
19 before this comes down.

20 So thank you, thank you to the attorneys for that. That is
21 true courage.

22 The Vax people, we'll talk about this, the CDC insider that
23 is going to talk about some of these things. There are some
24 people still out there that have courage. That's what we need
25 today, is that kind of courage.

26 The age of cowardice in the United States, and being caught
27 up in your pension, and being caught up in and how much you

18

20 So, I wrote *From The Company Of Shadows*, not for self-

22 heck of a battle.

23 When the book was written, I'll show you an expert, excerpt
24 rather, this is one of the excerpts from the book, one of the
25 pages of many, there is nothing classified in this excerpt at
26 all, nothing. It's talking about Blackout began receiving

29

2

20 I'll explain that to you in a moment.

21 Down at the bottom, blacks out the entities in case facts
22 are hidden in secret. That's not even their name behind that
23 blackout. It's a general term. They didn't want anybody to know
24 that they do this to civilians. Real important.

25 So what did I do?

26

27 [TYRANNY OF SECRECY]

28

29 I call this in Chapter 25, the tyranny of secrecy.

30 We have a tyrannical government that is now functioning
31 with a huge abuse of secrecy and silencing anybody that will
32 stand against it by classifying everything.

1 This photograph here, when I wrote the book, and they black
2 these things out, I had to decision to make. What am I going do
3 about this? I swore an oath to the Constitution. Who's going to
4 win government intimidation or the Constitution?

5 Well, it's a painful choice, but it's kind of an easy one.

6 So I built a code into the book. I referred to as a shadow
7 code, and there are things in it like this. This is the, this
8 shadow, is the actual shadow of the young man that almost died
9 from this toxic exposure.

10 They didn't know whose shadow that was, they do now.

11 Down here it says my family was devastated by our
12 government's abuse of blackout. They don't want you to know how
13 they tried to silence me. They blacked it out.

14 Although it's out there in the public in other places.
15 There's whole, there's studies this thick written on that thing.

16 So I built a code into the book. It's a numerical code and
17 weaves through there and if you follow the numerical sequence it
18 opens up what these blackouts actually say, and what they use to
19 try to silence our family. Okay?

20 I learned one thing:

21 If you play by their rules they will destroy you.

22

23 [FREEDOM IS ONLY IN THE TRUTH]

24

25 If you realize that freedom is only in the truth, and you
26 come out full bore, and just lay it out there, that's probably
27 why I'm still alive today.

28 You go out on the Internet you see things like, I'm
29 surprised this guy's not a dumpster.

30 Well, I'm still alive because I came out.

31 I have this thing called the Constitution and Freedom of
32 Speech. I came out full bore and made this stuff public.

1 If you fear them, they have you.

2 That's how they do it. They manipulate the American people
3 through intimidation and fear.

4 Do not fear.

5 If you don't fear the government you're truly free.

6 So, as I wrap this up, this is a time for courage. As I
7 mentioned, the age of cowardice in the United States, or being
8 too busy trying to survive, those days are gone.

9 The environment is collapsing.

10 Our economy is on the verge of collapse.

11 The federal government has programs in place that when the
12 economy does collapse, to take care of civil unrest in a very
13 extreme fashion. Some of you know about that.

14 It's very serious time.

15 It's a time for courage.

16 It's a time for truth.

17 Secret activity, especially illegal secret activity, is
18 like scorpions and cockroaches. You turn the light on and they
19 can't handle it man, they scramble for the nearest bookshelf [or
20 what right?].

21 So it is with government.

22

25

28 people from the tyranny of government because government will go

32 government. That's the whole reason it was written.

3 Courageous people like Dane [Wigington],
4 GeoEngineeringWatch, does that look like a normal sky to you?
5 God bless Dane for what he's doing. You know he is doing
6 this out of character. Really, raw courage and character at
7 personal sacrifice. And, I have to tell you, Dane [Wigington] is
8 the one that got me to come back in from the wilderness from off
9 the grid.

10 Because I had seen this go up to such high levels, and I
11 know some of the penetrations in the media, I had just had it.

12 So, I went off and built my little off the grid farm, and
13 put up our solar panels.

14 And, I think Dane worked me over for a couple of months,
15 and finally I said you know this guy's, this guy's really a man

5 We have to sit there and watch this, on a Monday. 94
6 degrees centigrade [sic]. Nine o'clock in the morning. Tuesday
7 morning, it's not there. All those trails are gone. There's an
8 ongoing joke I have with my wife Eileen to sue, and I'll say,
9 man it looks like they canceled all the traffic, air traffic
10 over Georgia. There's no condensation anywhere.

11 You see what a joke that is? One day the laws of physics
12 are one way and the next day all the laws of physics change.

13 One day there's trails, the next day they canceled all the
14 flights over Georgia. You know, I mean, come on, how ridiculous
15 can it get? But, it ruins our skyline.

16 I left, went off the grid, out on the wilderness to get
17 away from government tyranny, and all the ugliness I've seen,
18 and now I have to sit on my front porch and see them do it again
19 in the sky.

18 breaking into my house, they were drugging my dog, they were
19 painting chemicals on the ceiling.

20

21 [FEAR NO MORE]

22

23 But once I decided I'm not going to be afraid of you
24 anymore. I'm coming out full bore, and I'm coming out against
25 you full bore all the way. That's when things started to work on
26 our side.

27 That's when we started to win. And that's how we got the
28 book out.

29 When I made that decision, I will not fear you, the last
30 thing I told them was this, and then I'll put this quote up.

1 Last thing I said to them, I said the same courage that
 2 made me a good C.I.A. officer here with you is the same courage
 3 that is enabling me to stand up against you now.

4 And that's the last thing I told them before I walked out
 5 the door, and they know it.

6 So, I want you to remember this as I close:

7 When people fear their government there is tyranny, when
 8 the government fears to people, when they fear you, there is
 9 liberty.

10 And that's what it's all about.
