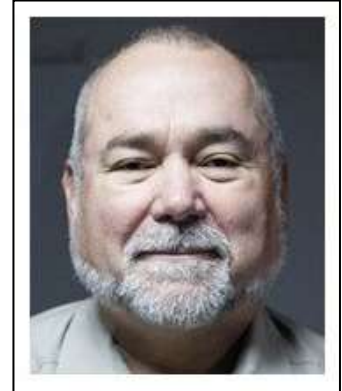

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11 MURPHY: Hi, guys, and welcome to another episode of GFM
 12 Media. I'm Brendon D. Murphy. And, this is Episode Number 65
 13 with ex-CIA Agent Robert David Steele.

14 This interview picks up the PedoGate thread and pursues
 15 some of the anonymous DHS insider's whistleblower revelations
 16 I've seen in the transcript from Victurus Libertas, as well as
 17 Robert's suggested solutions for our plethora of planetary ills
 18 as well as opportunities in disguise.

19 Please know, guys, that for our Australian viewers, prior
 20 to the interview, in our email exchange, Robert did establish
 21 that he had relatively little to speak to regarding Australia

1 players in the elite pedophile networks. But, as you'll see,
2 Australia is definitely not off his radar completely.

3 So, hope you enjoy the interview, and let us know your
4 feedback at the end. Thanks, guys.

5 MURPHY: All right, so you're ex-CIA. If I've got my facts
6 straight, you're ex-CIA. What was your, your primary role there
7 with the company?

8 STEELE: I was a clandestine operations case officer, which
9 is to say a spy. I received the standard six months training.
10 And, that only prepares you to be trained in the field. And
11 then, I did three back-to-back tours overseas, which is very
12 unusual. I had a recruiting average five times the regional
13 average, and I also had a production average five times that of
14 other case officers. In one ten case officer station I was
15 credited with one third of all recruitments in all production.

16 MURPHY: Wow that sounds pretty impressive. So, how did
17 you, how did you go from, from being such a stalwart performer
18 into where you are now, which is essentially what you could call
19 [an] anti-establishment figure. How did that happen?

20 STEELE: Well, I think the, the real beginning; the real
21 beginning was when I created the Marine Corps Intelligence
22 Command. I mean, first off, I was an infantry officer, and then
23 I joined the CIA because I found infantry in peacetime boring.
24 But then, after CIA the Marine Corps had used me as a reserve
25 officer the whole time I was, the nine years I was at CIA, they
26 had used me at their, their highest level, at the service level.
27 I was in what was called INTX, which is the interface between
28 tactical forces in the field and national spy capabilities,
29 including satellites.

30 So they invited me to come back and create the Marine Corps
31 Intelligence Center. And, it had never occurred to me until that

1 moment when my analysts were standing in line for the Internet,
2 and saying there's nothing in the secret databases on Haiti or
3 Burundi or Somalia [sites of known CIA covert activities and
4 atrocities] -

5 It had never occurred to me that our entire intelligence
6 community was a fraud. Never mind all the atrocities, OK?
7 Never mind the drone assassination program that kills 98%
8 innocents, or the torture and rendition program, or the fact
9 that we bribe people for a living, OK? Never mind all that.

10 The fact is the U.S. intelligence community is a fraud.
11 And now, it's a dangerous fraud because, since 9/11, NSA has
12 basically been surveilling, spying on all U.S. politicians, and
13 CIA has been blackmailing U.S. politicians, including Senator
14 John McCain and Senator Lindsey Graham. And the same is true
15 overseas. The American intelligence money has corrupted other
16 intelligence services, certainly including the Australian
17 intelligence service, as well as the United Kingdom.

18 And, we now know that - and I've written eight books on
19 this point - we now know that the craft of intelligence is a
20 very righteous, decent craft. It's about decision support.
21 It's about knowing what the question is, knowing who knows,
22 collection management, processing the information from many
23 sources, properly visualizing it, and then presenting it to a
24 decision maker on a single index card with three colors; red,
25 yellow and green, OK?

26 So the craft of intelligence is very, very important. The
27 intelligence community [today] does not do intelligence. It
28 does spies and secrecy that promote war and waste and bribery.
29 It does not do decision support.

30 I'll give you a very specific example - the UN High Level
31 Panel on Threats, Challenges and Change. Lieutenant General

1 Doctor Brent Scowcroft was the U.S. member of that panel. They
2 agreed that the ten high-level threats to humanity are, in the
3 following order:

4 [Counting with his fingers]

5 1. Poverty

6 2. Infectious disease

7 3. Environmental degradation

8 4. Interstate conflicts

9 5. Civil war

10 6. Genocide

11 7. Other atrocities, which includes trafficking in children

12 8. Proliferation

13 9. Terrorism

14 10. Transnational crime

15 The U.S. intelligence community only focuses on war and
16 terrorism. It's absolutely worthless with respect to poverty,
17 infectious disease, environmental degradation and those other
18 threats, including pedophilia, which is a huge problem in the
19 U.S., in Australia and in the United Kingdom.

20 So, I started out by writing my first book *On Intelligence:*
21 *Spies and Secrecy in an Open World*, and I became the czar, or
22 the Pope, the tall Poppy if you will - you Australians like to
23 cut down tall poppies. But, I became the Pope for open source
24 intelligence, which means doing decision support as
25 inexpensively as possible, and as usefully and most kindly as
26 possible.

27 Well, no one wanted to do this. And, the reason they
28 didn't want to do this is because if I succeed, we can cut the
29 secret intelligence budget by 75%. And, that's not what the
30 spies want, and, that's not what the politicians, who are bribed
31 and bullied and blackmailed by the spies, want.

1 So, the people have to want open source intelligence.
2 Now, I then went on to expand beyond open source
3 intelligence, which occurred more or less at the same time as
4 open source software and open source hardware. I then wrote in
5 2012, published a book called *The Open-Source Everything*
6 *Manifesto* in which I listed 60 opens, and then I went on after
7 that to - I went on after that to organize those 60 opens into
8 nine major categories.

9 So, you have open data, open access, open governance, which
10 includes open money, open politics and open standards. You have
11 open health, which destroys the health industry right now, which
12 is based on crime. And then, you have open infrastructure,
13 including open application program interfaces and open base
14 transceiver stations, which means free cellular and free
15 Internet access for everyone, OK?

16 I mean, a cell phone is nothing more than a ham radio,
17 dressed up. It really is. And, and so, we should have free
18 communications for everyone. Open manufacturing, open
19 provisioning, open energy, open food, open water.

20 I can solve most of the - I can solve all 17 of the UN
21 sustainable development goals in under ten years for 10% of the
22 projected costs by using open source everything engineering, OK?

23 To give you an example from Marcin Jakubowski, who runs
24 Open Source Ecology and created the Global Village Construction
25 Set. A John Deere tractor costs \$200,000. An open source
26 tractor cost \$20,000, 10%. A John Deere tractor cannot be
27 repaired by the farmer. It has to go into a proprietary, very
28 expensive repair shop, generally far away, and you lose the use
29 of the tractor for a long time. An open source tractor is so
30 simple it can be repaired by the farmer in the field, OK?

1 So, if we look at applying open source everything
2 engineering to housing, pressed brick construction, to energy,
3 solar, to water desalination, so that everyone has unlimited
4 clean water, or in India, clean the Ganges with open solar
5 energy, OK? That's Modi's highest priority, to clean the
6 Ganges, and it's, it's a rightful, righteous priority.

7 OK, then, finally, open, open software and open space, open
8 cities, open design, open innovation. We are at the very end of
9 hundreds of years of fencing the commons and criminalizing
10 private behavior. And, we're at the very beginning of coming
11 back full circle to where our indigenous Native Americans were,
12 where everything was open, and we are good stewards of the
13 earth, and nothing is shut off or made private.

14 I particularly think that there will be major changes in
15 land ownership over the next decade. I think we're going to
16 have to terminate absentee owners of, of land and property, and
17 communities should own the land. And, if you're occupying the
18 land, then you have a multi-generational lifetime possession of
19 that land as long as you do no harm. But, when your family dies
20 out, then the, the land reverts to the community.

21 MURPHY: Brilliant! I think, I think it's great that
22 you've actually started off by solving the world's problems,
23 because, I mean -

24 STEELE: I mean, I haven't solved the world's problems. I
25 first have to get people to listen to me - that's the hard -

26 MURPHY: Yeah, yeah, yeah, I know how that feels. But it's
27 good because, you know, the - what we're doing here and the
28 context this is going to appear in is going to be a solution-
29 based context, so it's great, especially, because in, in a
30 minute or however long it takes us to get there, I'm going to

1 steer us back towards the, you know, the PedoGate situation and
2 what's going on there.

3 So, it's good to have this, and so that people understand
4 the issues that face us now are, actually, you know, they are
5 solvable. I mean, it's really just a matter of will. And,
6 we've had the solutions in front of us or under our noses, in
7 many cases, for years and years and years and years, so it's not
8 like we have to sit down and, and think this stuff up. It's
9 already there, the solutions are already there.

10 STEELE: You're, you're absolutely right. And what, what I
11 realized as I watched George Soros try to destroy The United
12 States of America, is that we have been subject to divide and
13 conquer for too long. Race wars, gender wars, religious wars,
14 these are all fabricated; these are all created in order to
15 divide and conquer. The real war that has now started in
16 earnest is between the 99% and the 1%, between the public and
17 the Deep State.

18 And, so I believe that we're at the very beginning of the
19 emergence of public collective intelligence and public
20 collective morality, and we will begin to reverse the
21 criminalization of individual behavior and begin enforcing
22 sanctions against organizations that are committing atrocities
23 against all of us.

24 MURPHY: Brilliant, yeah, yeah. And we're saying great
25 stuff on one of those points to touch on. The - citizen,
26 citizen journalism now is just kicking the ass of the mainstream
27 media. Their, their narratives are absolutely falling to
28 pieces, and it's because there's so much firepower now. People
29 are switched on and waking up and giving a damn, and they're
30 taking it into their own hands and going, you know, well, that's
31 bullshit. I'm going to research this and find out.

1 And then we have, you know, WikiLeaks just going to town
2 on, on these people, and we're all out there just gobbling it up
3 and just analyzing the data, analyzing, analyzing, and there's
4 so much power behind that now. And it's, all it is, is people
5 just deciding to do this.

6 STEELE: I, I, I agree that there's a lot of power, and I
7 agree that the fake news mean that CIA started, which is kind of
8 like the conspiracy theorists mean, that it started to try and,
9 and silence people that were questioning the Kennedy narrative.
10 That has been flipped back on what I call the crap news network,
11 CNN, absolute garbage. Chris Cuomo still has some deep
12 emotional issues. He's been scarred for life coming out of New
13 York and the Cuomo crime family; but, coming back to this whole
14 citizen journalism thing.

15 So, there are, there are two major problems that I see.
16 The first is that Eric Schmidt is leading a conspiracy, and I
17 believe he should be placed under racketeering investigation.
18 Eric Schmidt is leading a conspiracy that includes Google,
19 Facebook, Twitter and surrogates, such as AdRoll and YouTube,
20 and they are censoring the Internet. They are, literally, in
21 the case of Donald Trump, squelching Donald Trump supporters and
22 elevating supporters of Hillary Clinton and George Soros and
23 Barack Obama. So, until we have an open Internet where no
24 censorship is possible, this will continue to be a major
25 problem.

26 The second problem is that in their zeal, citizen
27 journalists are making mistakes and destroying lives. I single
28 out Nora Maccabee and her father, who runs an orphanage in
29 Haiti. The zealous citizen journalists without proper training
30 in verification and validation and so forth have led to death
31 threats against this woman, mobs outside her house and so forth,

1 all because she lives near Comet Pizza, and a photograph of her
2 with James Alefantis has appeared in the social media. It's a
3 serious mistake to jump to the conclusion that she is aiding and
4 abetting pedophilia because she's had a photograph taken with a
5 pedophile.

6 I will tell you that if that were the standard of evidence,
7 then every person living in Sydney, London and Washington, D.C.
8 would be a pedophile simply by association, OK? So this is a
9 major problem. The standards for citizen journalism need to
10 rise, substantially.

11 MURPHY: Sure, sure. Now I'm going to steer you back to a
12 few basic questions now. We don't need to dwell on them, but I
13 want to ask you for the sake of the, the viewers. Number one,
14 what is, what is government actually about? What is its purpose
15 as you see it? I mean, you know, what is it really doing?

16 STEELE: What it's really doing is transferring wealth from
17 individuals to banks, period. I mean really, if you, if you, if
18 you look at the U - The United States is not a democracy. It's
19 a, it's a legalized crime family with many branches, two in
20 particular - the Republican crime family and the Democratic
21 crime family. And both of those crime families are led by
22 pedophiles, OK? I mean, Denny Hastert on the Republican side,
23 John Podesta and, and his ilk, not that Podesta's been proven a
24 pedophile, but the Podesta emails certainly give cause for
25 alarm.

26 And, so what we have here is individuals are no longer
27 governing themselves. I mean, Ayn Rand had a beautiful
28 statement in which she said that the day would come when
29 governments would feel free to do anything, and criminals and
30 individuals would have to ask the government for permission to
31 do anything. So we're there -

1 MURPHY: Yeah.

2 STEELE: We're there now. And, so I would like to see, I
3 would like to see a movement in which people literally go on
4 strike against their governments until electoral reform has
5 passed.

6 No government today, in my view, including the Australian
7 government, is completely honest. The politicians are put in
8 place through a mechanism that is rigged. In The United States,
9 the system is rigged 12 different ways, and I have published
10 this online. If anyone looks up "rigged 12 ways", they'll get
11 right to it, so there are 12 specific fixes that are needed,
12 including paper ballots. The electronic voting system is
13 completely fraudulent and easily manipulated with what's called
14 fractional voting, so that you can predetermine the outcome for
15 any given district. So government is, in my view, not
16 government. It's a form of legalized crime right now.

17 MURPHY: Okay, so you've answered my second question
18 brilliantly, which is do we have a real functioning democracy,
19 which is obviously no. So, so they are moving then to the Deep
20 State.

21 Now I - you've been quoted, well, I've got you down saying,
22 the Deep State begins with the Rothschilds and the Vatican, so
23 the Rothschilds, as you say, were instrumental in setting up the
24 central banks, and that means that essentially private interests
25 control the public resources. So, can you just comment briefly
26 on that for our, for our viewers?

27 STEELE: I think central banking is, is one of the, is the
28 single biggest crime of the century - or in history - because,
29 you know, the, the, the real billionaires in the City of London
30 and Wall Street are laughing at Donald Trump.

1 Basically, billionaires make their money two ways. By
2 manipulating the interest rates and the foreign exchange rates,
3 as we had in the LIBOR scandal and so forth in the City of
4 London; or by externalizing costs to the public, for instance,
5 the Koch Brothers (that's the proper pronunciation of their
6 name) - the Koch Brothers are polluting every river near every
7 single one of their factories. They're not paying the true
8 cost. They're not paying for the natural capital that they're
9 consuming.

10 If western industry were required to actually do true cost
11 economics, then I would say easily 70% of it would not be
12 profitable and would go away. And, of course, we have, we have
13 created, we have created industries that actually kill people
14 with foods that make them fat. And, we have now shampoos with
15 little plastic polymers that are indestructible, that are going
16 into the ocean, OK?

17 So basically, banking, banking that is not communal in
18 nature is legalized crime. It's that simple. I mean, when
19 bankers want to buy something, they invent three million dollars
20 and they go buy the property with this invented three million
21 dollars. They've just literally stolen that property based on
22 false credit, so I, I have a real problem with this, and I think
23 we're going to need to get to a point where a lot of this
24 digital wealth simply goes away. I see a debt jubilee coming in
25 the future.

26 One of the ideas that I've tried to get to Donald Trump is
27 a debt renunciation pledge. We have three trillion dollars in
28 debt in The United States, from individuals to banks, roughly
29 divided between student debt, credit card family debt and
30 elderly health debt, and if Donald Trump were to be empowered by
31 150 million Americans to renegotiate that debt, I'm pretty sure

1 he could get it down to 20%, if not nothing. We really - the
2 whole, the whole banking thing is, is a scam.

3 MURPHY: Couldn't agree with you more on that one. So I've
4 actually said, I've said to people, that I think Trump is, is
5 the first actual real president, if you like real president,
6 since JFK. So, you know, he essentially beat the propaganda
7 system to win against the odds, so other people have put out the
8 idea that he's, he's owned or bought or controlled opposition or
9 something. I mean, how do you respond to that idea?

10 STEELE: Well, the jury's still out. He won accidentally,
11 and there were some of us that speculated that prior to the
12 election, he had been given a promise of 20 billion dollars from
13 Lynn Rothschild, Lady Lynn Rothschild, who's a [garbled] from
14 New Jersey, and - because every time he looked like he was going
15 to win, he did something that seemed almost intended to pull him
16 back from winning, and then he won accidentally. And your
17 viewers can find my *Donald Trump, Accidental President* just by
18 looking for it online. It's also, everything is on Kindle, and
19 it's also free online.

20 Now, it looks like he has gotten over ten people from
21 Goldman Sachs working for him, and it looks like he is allowing
22 Dick Cheney and Bob Gates to continue to manage U.S. national
23 security policy toward a war with Iran and a war with Russia.
24 Some of us are hopeful that his preliminary moves that look bad
25 were in fact a form of life insurance, because I'm quite certain
26 that if he had come out full bore, living up to all of his
27 promises, such as withdrawing from NATO - which I absolutely
28 believe is essential - NATO is a pimp for the whores of war, as
29 I've said in other venues.

30 What Donald Trump has not done is actually thought deeply
31 about an Electoral Reform Act. My "Memorandum for the

1 President", which he has read, I'm told, has been read by one
2 million people. And your viewers with tinyURL familiarity can
3 go to tinyurl.com/Memo4Trump.

4 He needs to grow beyond the two-party tyranny. He won by
5 accident in a system rigged by the two-party tyranny. Now he
6 has a remarkable opportunity to restore democracy, the Republic
7 in The United States.

8 I had to run for president in 2012 to learn that there are
9 eight accredited political parties in The United States. Six of
10 them are blocked from ballot access by the Republican and
11 Democratic parties. The other six are Constitution, Green,
12 Libertarian, Natural, Law Reform and Socialist. There's only
13 like a thousand three hundred socialists in The United States,
14 not counting Bernie Sanders. But there are a considerable
15 number of Libertarians (including myself), and, although the
16 Libertarians can get on every ballot, they can't get into the
17 debates - because the Republican and Democratic parties stole
18 the debates from the League of Women Voters because they were
19 allowing third, fourth and fifth parties in.

20 So, the electoral reform act that I've crafted, drawing on
21 hundreds and hundreds of activists across The United States, has
22 12 specific fixes, and those fixes are needed in all countries,
23 including Australia, not just in The United States of America.

24 MURPHY: Sure, and that's - I'm glad you mentioned that,
25 actually. OK, so we, we know you've identified a lot of
26 different things that need cleaning up and how to go about it.
27 So, one of the things you have spoken about is giving the Deep
28 State an exit strategy, a way out, so that we can transition
29 into creating the world we actually want to live in.

30 STEELE: Right.

1 MURPHY: So, what's the rationale here, because a lot of
2 people are on about, you know, holding them to account and
3 justice and all this sort of stuff. But you've repeatedly,
4 you've said, you repeatedly state you're a big fan of
5 reconciliation and so on. So, what's your rationale here?

6 STEELE: Well, I was one of the first case officers
7 assigned terrorism as a full-time target, and I have some people
8 I deal with that are very, very skilled at interrogation without
9 torture. And, in fact, we have this one army colonel who, every
10 time we go to war, we bring him back from retirement, and he
11 creates the equivalent of a Marriott Courtyard in the middle of
12 the desert, and all of our high-value prisoners are put in
13 there, and they're treated with dignity, and they're allowed to
14 bathe, and they're well fed, and they spill their guts, because
15 it's made very clear to them that there is a very positive exit
16 strategy for them. Otherwise, if you start to torture people,
17 they start inventing stuff and doing fake stuff, OK?

18 Now, the Deep State, managed by the Rothschilds - who are
19 the only real trillionaires on the planet - the Deep State
20 consists of roughly a thousand billionaires, all of whom have
21 absolutely no wish to see the Deep State go away because the
22 Deep State is how they protect themselves. It's how they make
23 their money. It's how they legalize their crimes and
24 criminalize our individual initiative.

25 You don't back jackals into a corner, OK? You need to have
26 an exit strategy, and it may well be that there are some who are
27 so horrendous that, that they'd have to be killed. But,
28 frankly, my interest - when I catch a pedophile - my interest is
29 in getting every bit of useful information I can about them, to
30 include which corporate law firms are being used to channel
31 orphans into pedophile networks, OK?

1 So the emphasis here is on collecting all possible
2 information and then educating the public so that it never
3 happens again. Vindictive justice may make some people feel
4 good, but it doesn't protect the future, all right.

5 This is a massive, massive problem. This is far more than,
6 than a few days in jail to, to discourage the others, OK? This
7 is - pedophilia is embedded in, in all societies. Some, like
8 Afghanistan, it's openly practiced, and little boys are groomed
9 from birth to be dancing girls and to be the buttocks for, for
10 Afghan men.

11 But others, like the United Kingdom, Jimmy Savile and his
12 best friend, Prince Charles, and so forth; and The United
13 States, where Denny Hastert, Speaker of the House, is one of our
14 most prominent pedophiles; the whole internship problem that we
15 had in the Congress where young boys are abused by Congressmen.
16 This is all very real, and it's also very much not being looked
17 after by law enforcement.

18 In The United States of America - I can't speak to
19 Australia - but in The United States of America, we have 18,000
20 police jurisdictions, every single one of which will not touch a
21 pedophilia case - they just won't do it.

22 MURPHY: That's a, that's a staggering number. I know
23 people, I know people who would listen to that and go "that's -
24 no way, it's not possible, it can't be happening".

25 STEELE: Look, the last really big pedophilia scandal we
26 had was the Franklin scandal in Nebraska, and that one was just
27 so obvious that they had to do something about it.

28 In Virginia on Halloween, I'm told that five times the
29 number of children are kidnapped on Halloween night in Virginia
30 than everywhere else in the country. Five times, OK?
31 Washington is ground zero for pedophilia in The United States

1 with New York City and Boston being second and third. And, I
2 guess, Los Angeles. In fact, Los Angeles has a private taxi
3 service for pedophiles because they want trusted people whose
4 financial dependency is such that they'll keep quiet. This is
5 really just outrageous, outrageous.

6 MURPHY: That's, that's, that's one word for it, yeah,
7 absolutely. So you've, you've spoken about Bill, Bill and
8 Hillary Clinton actually going to Jeffrey Epstein's Lolita
9 Island and saying -

10 STEELE: Individually.

11 MURPHY: Individually, you noted individually, yes, so,
12 yeah, please - please elaborate.

13 STEELE: I can't elaborate beyond the fact of their
14 documented travel, individually, to Lolita Island. Now I
15 believe Lolita Island is, is half the set. I believe there's a
16 no-name hotel in New York. This is a hotel that does not
17 advertise, and you don't know it's there unless you've been
18 told. And I believe there's a no-name hotel in, in New York
19 that is also wired for video.

20 It's now known that Jeffrey Epstein got his billion from a
21 real billionaire [Leslie Wexner], and he's basically a Mossad
22 agent, and his job is to get all U.S. politicians, including
23 Chuck Schumer, on video doing something really terrible.
24 Jeffrey Epstein is the Mossad's greatest blackmail asset in The
25 United States of America.

26 And, it's very relevant that Robert Maxwell's daughter is
27 part of his procurement network, and she is - there's a book -
28 Robert Maxwell, *Israel's Superspy*, OK? The, the, the Israelis
29 are very, very good at leveraging pedophilia to achieve Zionist
30 objectives, and I know a lot of my Mossad colleagues are very
31 honorable men. They don't like it. They don't agree with

1 Netanyahu's settlements and a lot of these other atrocities that
2 are being committed against Palestine.

3 But the fact of the matter is, if there's one intelligence
4 service in the world that's really, really good at pedophilia
5 exploitation, it's the Israeli intelligence service.

6 MURPHY: Right. So you've said, OK, you've said that
7 basically, Epstein has footage of every major U.S. politician
8 doing something terrible, probably to a child.

9 STEELE: I speculate that that has been his assignment. I
10 don't think he's gotten everybody, but he's certainly gotten,
11 he's certainly gotten ten or fifteen percent, easily.

12 You know, in The United States, one Senator can stop the
13 government. All you have to do is get one Senator to place a
14 hold on a bill, and they can do it secretly. So, in The United
15 States, it's possible to stop things very, very easily if you
16 have just one Senator on your payroll. And I'm quite certain
17 that among our, our hundred Senators, I would say no fewer than
18 20 to 25 are pedophiles.

19 MURPHY: OK, that's a very high percentage.

20 STEELE: Well, I think - it's very interesting to me that
21 pedophilia and wealth seem to go together.

22 MURPHY: Yeah, that is interesting. I mean, is that
23 something you've, you've pondered on, or studied, a lot - that
24 particular link?

25 STEELE: There's, there's a sense of impunity, there is a
26 sense of privilege, there is this sense of anything goes.

27 Matt Taibi has written a couple really good books. One is
28 called *Griftopia*, and the other one is called *The Divide*. And
29 *The Divide* is about two different legal systems. The reality is
30 there's one legal system to keep all the little people in, in,
31 in, in check. And then, there's another legal system that is

1 just for the rich, in which they can do anything, including
2 murder, and get away with it.

3 So, I think, I think we're, we're looking at ourselves in
4 the mirror now, and I think we're at a, we're at a very
5 interesting point in time. I'm hopeful that the public is
6 awakening now.

7 MURPHY: Yeah, it, it looks to be that way, at least, quite
8 spectacularly in some regards, in America. I'm seeing
9 Australia's lagging behind in a lot of ways, but we're trying to
10 do what we can about that.

11 So, we've got about what, 1500, more than 1500 pedophile
12 arrests now since Trump took office?

13 STEELE: Yes, and, and I credit Jeff Sessions with that. I
14 also believe that James Comey is salvageable. He's an
15 honorable, intelligent man, and he's in for a longer term, and
16 so, I'd like to hope that the FBI will eventually get a grip.

17 His own people are in a state of revolt, because the
18 Clintons have been a crime family ever since they were in
19 Arkansas, and CIA turned Arkansas into a landing platform for
20 drugs and, and guns and other illicit smuggling activities.

21 I think that Trump did this, in part, to achieve pressure
22 on the pedophiles that lead the Democratic and Republican
23 parties. I wish he had done the Electoral Reform Act first, but
24 he's probably much smarter than I am. And, maybe he needed do
25 this pedophilia assault kind of as a warning notice. And then,
26 hopefully, he'll come back now and do electoral reform.

27 And, by the way, electoral reform frees all the existing
28 incumbent members from their dependency on banking and corporate
29 money. There are 42 billionaires that own the two parties in
30 The United States of America.

1 In fact, just today, I posted a, a post that reads "U.S.
2 Oligarchy - Fascists on the Left, Fascists on the Right, No
3 Difference". And then, the subtitle is "How Donald Trump Can
4 Take Down the Deep State in 90 Days". OK, I know how to take
5 down the Deep State, but I'm having trouble getting a meeting
6 with Donald Trump.

7 MURPHY: Yeah, I can, I can imagine that's challenging at
8 the best of times. So, there are also several major Democrat
9 figures you've, you've noted who are on notice for potential
10 arrest?

11 STEELE: I don't have names, and, and I really do believe
12 in, in due process of law. What, what concerns me right now is
13 that Trump has no grand strategy. He doesn't have a strategy.
14 His, his strategy is to get through the week, and I think he can
15 do so much better.

16 I completely agree with you that Trump is the first
17 president since John F. Kennedy that has not been anointed by
18 the Deep State. He scares them, but he doesn't have all the
19 equipment that he needs to, to defeat the Deep State, and, when
20 I say defeat, I mean in a truth and reconciliation mode. It is
21 not my wish to do a scorched earth or a teardown of the Deep
22 State. I just want them to get out of the way and let us create
23 peace and prosperity for everybody on the planet.

24 You know, I mean, these refugees are our making. The
25 United States is the greatest purveyor of violence on the
26 planet, and we need to get - all of our bases overseas should be
27 closed. And, I do want to mention, I believe that we have a
28 thousand military bases all over the world so that CIA can
29 smuggle guns, gold, drugs, cash and small children, OK?

30 We need to close all of those bases, and we need to respect
31 the sovereignty of every country that we deal with. We need to

1 bring our military home and spend ten years rebuilding our
2 military, but keep it at home. Be able to deliver it anywhere
3 we need to in a, in a, in a week's time, but keep it at home.

4 And, for Australia, you know - one of the things I'd love
5 to see Australia do is create some open source innovation
6 centers that it shares with Indonesia, because the fastest way
7 to solve your illegal immigrant problem is to create prosperity
8 where they are, and not have them try to come to Australia.

9 And, you've got a lot of desert area. I'm really impressed
10 by the stuff that's going on outside Perth - Sunnyside Farms,
11 and, and whatnot. They're using solar energy to desalinate
12 seawater, and they've created an aquaponics industry that is
13 truly impressive.

14 I anticipate the day coming when Australia is lush green in
15 every corner, using seawater. I actually calculated how many
16 plants it would take to keep sea level. It's rising three
17 millimeters every year, so it's something like 300-367 plants -
18 it's, it's a lot. But Australia should have water desalination
19 plants every 25 miles around its circumference, and these should
20 all be pumping desalinated, clean water into the interior of
21 Australia. And, you will gradually see vibrant villages
22 building up, kind of going in toward the center, OK?

23 And, when you get to Alice Springs, just tear it down, sew
24 salt into the earth, and leave that as a memory of American
25 intelligence thrown out of the country.

26 MURPHY: Yeah, you mentioned Alice Springs, in, in your
27 email. So, I mean, what can you tell us about what's been going
28 on there, because that's even - that's relatively new to me. I
29 mean, I know that America, you know, Mossad, CIA have been busy,
30 but tell us about Alice Springs.

1 STEELE: James Bamford has written a number of books in
2 which Alice Springs is featured. It turns out that Alice
3 Springs is a natural receiving station for atmospheric
4 communications signals. And it may be that Alice Springs is no
5 longer needed, because in today's digital environment, NSA has
6 put backdoors into everything, including Intel chips, OK?

7 So, I don't know where Alice Springs is today, but what I
8 do know is it's time to shut down the secret intelligence
9 community. It's time to create an open source intelligence
10 community, and it's time to put the public back into power.
11 And, you do that with open source intelligence, and you create
12 prosperity with open source engineering.

13 MURPHY: What, what does open source intelligence actually
14 look like on a sort of ground level and functional -
15 functionality-wise?

16 STEELE: Well, one of the problems that I've had is that
17 CIA has managed to castrate the open source intelligence
18 business. They've limited it to social media monitoring and
19 reading newspapers. OSINT is actually about being able to
20 harness the distributed intelligence of every human being. So,
21 I'll give you a very specific example, which has appeared in one
22 other tape, but I'll - for your viewers.

23 U.S. Southern Command was not happy with CIA's reporting on
24 the Nicaraguan economy, because they don't care about Nicaragua,
25 and they certainly don't care about economies. And, so they
26 asked Booz Allen if they would do a report of the Nicaraguan
27 economy. And, Booz Allen said "Sure, no problem, it'll take
28 \$250,000 and it'll take a year of time" - which is - roughly
29 \$250K buys one man year, OK, which can be compressed by having
30 multiple people work for several months.

1 And it was more money than they had, so they turn to me,
2 and they said "What can you do?" and I said "Well, how about-" -
3 this was a Friday - I said "How about \$250 and I'll have a 4-
4 page report for you on Monday". And they said "You're insane,
5 you can't do that" and I said "Oh, yes, I can. The guy who used
6 to be the governor of the Bank of Nicaragua just retired. He's
7 living in Minnesota, and I have his email". And, so he said,
8 "Oh".

9 So I sent the guy an email - I had met him at a conference,
10 an academic conference a couple weeks before, just by sheer
11 coincidence - I sent him an email. I said "I'm going to FedEx
12 you a check, and this is what I want", and he did it. It took
13 him four hours. It's the best report they ever had. That's
14 open source intelligence, OK? And you can do that on anything.
15 You can do that on poverty at the district level, you could do
16 that on infectious diseases.

17 I mean, one of the problems we have today is that the
18 government lies a lot. In The United States of America, the
19 Center for Disease Control and the Food and Drug Administration
20 are both criminal networks, OK? They're there to rubber-stamp
21 poisonous foods and unhealthy vaccines that sterilize and cause
22 autism and do other kinds of things, OK?

23 So, I don't trust the elements of the U.S. government.
24 There are good people in the U.S. government trapped in a bad
25 system. But I absolutely do not trust the Center for Disease
26 Control, Food and Drug Administration, telecommunications. U.S.
27 government is incapable with governing, OK, and, and that's
28 something we need to really, really get back to.

29 Let me just mention a book that I admire very much. Elinor
30 Ostrom *Governing the Commons*. She got the Nobel Prize in
31 Economics because her case studies demonstrated that the only

1 people who actually know enough to make sensible regulations are
2 local people. And, the only people who are able to enforce
3 those regulations in a sensible, consistent manner are the local
4 people, OK? Trying to govern from afar is a prescription for
5 insanely criminal misbehavior. We really need to localize
6 governance as much as possible.

7 MURPHY: I could not agree more, and, and the thing with,
8 with, you know, governing from afar, a centralized governing
9 system, is that when they come up with a bogus policy or
10 something that's just patently absurd or insane, and the locals
11 don't like it because they have a better way of doing things,
12 then it has to be enforced with, with violence or coercion or
13 extortion or something.

14 STEELE: I agree, I agree, and, and one of the things that
15 I think we're going to see over the next 20 years is
16 secessionist movements, succeeding. I believe that it's no
17 longer possible for a military to keep a population subdued.
18 Asymmetric warfare and the ability of individuals to wreak havoc
19 on organized militaries and law enforcement has just gotten too
20 great.

21 Now, that only works if you have an educated population,
22 and so, part of the challenge is to bring up the education of
23 the population at the same time that you oppose the imposition
24 of external rule.

25 MURPHY: Which is the exact inverse of, of what we've had
26 with the Rockefeller dumbed down education, and, yeah, the exact
27 opposite -

28 STEELE: Yes, everything's been dumbed down, including the
29 media and the universities. You know, the universities now -
30 the professors are scared, they're, they're frightened. They're
31 basically at risk of losing their jobs if they actually teach

1 their students how to think critically or if they question the
2 motives of the government, or, or whatever.

3 MURPHY: You know, I've lost count of the number of stories
4 I've been told about people who were at university or college
5 and they, they wouldn't go with the flow, and they're [garbled]
6 their writing, and they had challenged the conventional thinking
7 and, you know, they were failed, they were kicked out, whatever
8 happened, just happened time and time again, you know. It just
9 isn't acceptable to, to be a nonconformist, to actually think
10 and have a different viewpoint on things, which I would have
11 thought the exact opposite of the purpose of a real education.

12 So, I'm going to steer it back into the, into the horrible,
13 nasty sort of stuff for a minute to finish the, the, the, the
14 thread. Let's talk about the Virginia Roberts stuff, Epstein
15 and, and Dershowitz. What's going on there?

16 STEELE: I, I don't know any more than your, your
17 intelligent readers know. What I have been trying to do is
18 publicize the fact that every single person visiting Lolita
19 Island is probably being blackmailed by the Mossad. I don't
20 think the FBI has made that jump yet.

21 They haven't been willing to take the airplane logs, and
22 then systematically debrief every single person that's been to
23 Jeffrey Epstein's island. There is no one in The United States
24 that's actually trying to map all of the pedophilia networks,
25 which include corporate law firms that specialize in papering
26 children, so that they can be moved.

27 And, I, I, I know Sacha Stone from Humanidad is starting up
28 a new international commission on pedophilia, and I have been
29 asked to be a commissioner.

30 And, I'm also in the process of getting estimates for what
31 it would take. And, what I have found most interesting is that

1 the top professionals that I have asked for, for cost estimates
2 have gone totally silent on me. They're not willing to bid on
3 the job.

4 MURPHY: Wow.

5 STEELE: They're afraid.

6 MURPHY: You've mentioned fear, in, in other ways, you've,
7 you've talked about fear being a very powerful driving force.

8 And, actually, I'm going to jump to the DHS, the Department
9 of Homeland Security insider who spoke with the, the guys at
10 Victurus Libertas. And he was telling them, among other things,
11 he mentioned to talk to, to you, and he said to them - massive
12 arrests following what's on, you know, analysis of what's on
13 Anthony Weiner's hard drive, you know, and what videos exist
14 through Jeffrey Epstein.

15 I didn't know if you wanted to comment on that at all, but
16 I've got a couple more along that, that line. So, is there
17 anything you want to add to that?

18 STEELE: There's, there's a couple of things I'd, I'd like
19 to say. The first is, I believe the Department of Homeland
20 Security needs to be dismantled. It should be put out of
21 business.

22 And the Federal Emergency Management Agency needs to be led
23 by a true libertarian - that's, that's a scary kind of place.
24 One of the things we're moving toward is where people can be
25 incarcerated if they're not vaccinated. We're moving in some
26 very, very troubling directions.

27 Second thing I would say is, I really do believe that most
28 people, 95% of the people working in government, including in
29 the CIA and including in DHS, are good people trapped in a bad
30 system.

1 The third thing I would say is that NSA has every email and
2 every phone call made by everybody in The United States in the
3 last ten years, but they don't provide support to the FBI or the
4 CIA.

5 When I was a case officer overseas, I had to use a bottle
6 of Scotch to get my local NSA person to give me some hits on
7 terrorism, and the bottle only bought one day of hits. And I
8 said "Why can't I get this every day?" and he said "Because our
9 priorities are set by Washington, and Washington doesn't care
10 about terrorism.", OK?

11 This was back in the 1980s. So, knowing what I know about
12 what NSA has, there is absolutely no question in my mind that if
13 William Binney were given - he's one of the NSA honorable men
14 who, who blew the whistle on NSA's crimes against humanity - if
15 William Binney were given the task of harvesting all of the
16 emails and phone calls from pedophiles, starting with Jeffrey
17 Epstein, and the known pedophiles, including Bill Clinton,
18 there's no question but that we'd have them all within 30 to 90
19 days.

20 MURPHY: Wow.

21 STEELE: The data's there, the data's there. And, frankly,
22 if I were a billionaire pedophile, I'd be working frantically to
23 find a way to zero out the NSA databases.

24 MURPHY: Yeah, so can you, can you - it really irritates me
25 sometimes, the, the mythology that's been built up around the
26 Clintons, Hillary and Bill. I, I would like to see people start
27 moving past the, you know, the façade and understanding who and
28 what they actually are. Is there much intel floating around
29 that you've been made aware of regarding their proclivities, if
30 you know what I mean?

1 STEELE: Well, the short answer is I have, I have nothing
2 that would, that would stand up in a court of law, but I'm quite
3 certain that if I put investigators on it - look, first off, the
4 Clintons are small-town, small- town crooks that made it big
5 because CIA elevated them.

6 One of the books that really educated me on the depth of
7 corruption at the state and local level is called *Deer Hunting*
8 *With Jesus*. And, and, there's another book by, by a former FBI
9 guy who was the Special Agent in Charge in Little Rock,
10 Arkansas, Ivian Smith, and I forget the title of the book
11 [Inside: A Top G-Man Exposes Spies, Lies, and Bureaucratic
12 Bungling in the FBI].

13 But what this boils down to is there are three levels of
14 grotesque government criminality in The United States of
15 America. There's the federal level of crime. There's the state
16 level of crime. And there's the local level of crime.

17 And, an example of local level corruption is where all
18 these good old boys give tax exemptions and pollution exemptions
19 to a company that comes to their town and pollutes their river
20 and pays no taxes, but they get a very large, disproportionate
21 real estate commission, OK?

22 So, there's many forms of bribery, and what you have here
23 is a lack of transparency that basically allows the public to be
24 sodomized by its local, state and national officials because no
25 one's paying attention. And, the media, which is supposed to be
26 paying attention, is part of the, the rigged system.

27 So, we're really at the very beginning, I think, of a, of a
28 new level of transparency and education that is required. And,
29 the good news is, there is plenty of wealth for everybody to do
30 well. Right now, wealth is concentrated in a way that creates
31 poverty, unnecessarily.

1 MURPHY: Oh, absolutely, and, that's by design, as far as I
2 can tell.

3 STEELE: Yes.

4 MURPHY: OK, so this - back to the DHS insider, whoever
5 they are, they've, they've said if people knew the true motives
6 of the pedophilia, pedophilia epidemic, people would do a lot
7 more than just march on Washington. So, he was, he was fearing
8 a revolution.

9 So, I wanted to ask you, what are the quote unquote true
10 motives behind the pedophilia networks, and what, what is this
11 fear about if people learn the whole truth?

12 STEELE: Well, first off, I'm very concerned that
13 pedophilia seems to be deliberately spreading to first
14 responders. We're starting to catch more and more firefighters
15 and policemen with child porn. This seems to be a very
16 deliberate effort to corrupt their morale, their, their morals.

17 And, in fact, one Senator - I forget which one - but one
18 Senator revealed a memorandum in which the Department of Justice
19 under Loretta Lynch was planning to legalize pedophilia. It was
20 one of 12 perversions that they were thinking about legalizing.

21 MURPHY: Wow.

22 STEELE: Herbert Marcuse wrote an excellent last third of a
23 book on repressive tolerance. Repressive tolerance is when
24 anything goes, and when anything goes, you lose your moral
25 spine. You literally lose all values. You lose all sense of
26 propriety, all sense of morality.

27 You know, to make it legal to molest a child, I mean,
28 that's what Hillary Clinton would have been about had she been
29 elected, OK, because she has a fondness for young yoga
30 instructors, apparently. Bill Clinton has a fondness for young
31 anything, and so I think we really, we really need to think

1 about what kind of nation do we want to have. What kind of
2 society do we want to have? And, for me, it all comes back to
3 electoral reform.

4 When Tom Steyer announced that he had spent \$74 million
5 dollars trying to influence climate change legislation, and
6 failed, I realized that no issue is going to get an honest
7 hearing in any government until we achieve electoral reform. If
8 we don't put the power back into the public hands, then
9 government will continue to be nothing more than legalized
10 crime.

11 MURPHY: Now, OK, so I'm going - I'm just going to finish
12 this DHS insider thread here. So, he, he was quoted as saying,
13 many of the politicians on both sides, as you've mentioned
14 already, have been compromised by the CIA or Mossad for years.
15 And, it's actually not - when we hear them, you know, wax
16 lyrical about how wonderful Israel is, it's not actually genuine
17 admiration, it's fear. So, how deep, I'm going to ask you, how
18 deep does the fear of Israel run?

19 STEELE: Well, it's a, it's a very important point. I
20 think the fear runs very deep. And, let me point out, I
21 actually, I - look, there are only nine million Jewish voters in
22 The United States of America, nine million. That is an
23 insignificant number in relation to the 150 to 200 million
24 eligible voters from among the three hundred million that live
25 in The United States of America, OK?

26 Israel's power in The United States is based on bribery and
27 blackmail, period. Now one of the things I've thought about is
28 that not only do we need to free our members from bribery by
29 corporations, we also need to free them from blackmail by Israel
30 and others, OK? I'm sure Goldman Sachs has a very sophisticated
31 blackmail operation, as do elements of the City of London, OK?

1 So, one of the ways you do that is you bring every member
2 in individually, and you give them an opportunity for a
3 presidential pardon, provided they fully disclose who is
4 blackmailing them, and then you go after the blackmailers, not
5 the members, OK?

6 I want to free our members. I am totally devoted to every
7 member of Congress having an honorable exit strategy from
8 bribery and blackmail. It is not my intent to punish members of
9 Congress for having been blackmailed and bribed. It is my
10 intent to get the blackmailers and the bribers.

11 MURPHY: Yeah, I'm - some people are going to ask at this
12 point, well, what do we do with the, the pedophiles who've been
13 blackmailed?

14 STEELE: Send them to Australia.

15 MURPHY: Thanks, we have enough, we have enough already,
16 thanks. Convicts and rabbits. Yeah, it's lovely all year
17 round, you know.

18 STEELE: You know, I mean, I, I, I think we really need to
19 get a grip on who and how and why. I would say 80% of your
20 pedophiles can probably stop if they know that there, there are
21 penalties that will be enforced. Twenty percent of them may be
22 so far beyond the pale that they need to be institutionalized, I
23 don't know.

24 But, my bottom line is, we've got to get all of the facts
25 on the table, and you cannot get all the facts on the table
26 without a truth and reconciliation approach. And then, once you
27 have all the facts on the table, then you can make a considered
28 decision as to what needs to be done.

29 My bottom line is there are millions of children that need
30 to be rescued. There are millions of pedophiles that need to be
31 identified. And, we're in for a very long haul here.

1 I mean, you know, between the Catholic Church and
2 Afghanistan and Saudi Arabia, you've got institutionalized
3 pedophilia. So, there's, there's a long way to go here, but I
4 do feel that the Internet and the ability, for example, of you
5 in Australia and me here in Virginia to have this Skype
6 conversation, and for this - this video will live forever, OK?

7 I think we're at the very beginning of a moral and
8 intellectual and communications education intelligence
9 revolution, and my, my favorite book is the one called
10 *Intelligence For Earth: Clarity, Diversity, Integrity &*
11 *Sustainability*, and it's free online if you don't want to buy it
12 from Amazon.

13 I would like to be the Pope for global intelligence. I
14 would like to make it possible for every human mind to connect
15 with every bit of useful information 24/7. I'd like to create
16 the world brain, a school of future oriented hybrid governance,
17 a United Nations open source decision support information
18 network.

19 I think we should stop funding the United Nations,
20 actually. What we should be doing is delivering open source
21 engineering data and micro payments to the village level.

22 MURPHY: Sure.

23 STEELE: Get out of the way.

24 MURPHY: Yeah, yeah, let the people help themselves.

25 STEELE: Exactly. Give them the tools and the knowledge
26 and the micro cash needed, and cut out all that first-class
27 travel for UN bureaucrats and NGOs.

28 I mean, look at Bono, OK? Bono's a thief. One percent of
29 all donations go to their intended purpose. I mean, Bono set
30 the gold bar. Bill Clinton is right next to him, OK? Out of
31 billions donated, Clinton spends five million a year on actual

1 good work, OK? Clinton is, is - the, the three Clintons - Bill,
2 Hillary and Chelsea - are the gold standard for charity fraud.

3 MURPHY: OK? Let, let that be heard everywhere, loud and
4 clear, stay away. So, I want to ask you regarding the PedeGate
5 situation, this DHS insider has estimated that approximately one
6 in three politicians have been secretly extorted - and he
7 doesn't say - does that sound right to you, that figure?

8 STEELE: Yeah. I would have gone with one in four, but I
9 think one in three and, and, actually, if you say influenced,
10 it's easily closer to a hundred percent.

11 MURPHY: Yeah.

12 STEELE: Because a lot of times blackmail can be soft, OK,
13 rather than hard. I'm quite sure that every one of our Senators
14 and members of Congress has been forced to compromise their
15 integrity - one hundred percent. And then, you move in varying
16 levels, but I think one in three is probably not enough. I
17 think one in two is probably closer to his intended meaning.

18 MURPHY: Right, OK, OK, thanks for clarifying that. So, do
19 you think it's realistic that we might expect any video leaks of
20 these politicians being caught out in compromising situations
21 anytime soon?

22 STEELE: Well, a lot hinges on whether we can preserve the
23 NSA databases, because I believe that a lot of this stuff is out
24 there. Now, another, another, another major asset would be the
25 Mossad itself. I think we need a two-state solution in Israel.
26 In many ways, Israel and Saudi Arabia are the festering cancer
27 that's going to take down Europe. And we really need to address
28 that.

29 All humanity needs to be concerned with the fate of the
30 Palestinian people. We need to end the settlements. I would
31 like the Palestinian state to run from Gaza to Jericho.

1 And we, we really need to stop the atrocities. We also
2 need to stop U.S. elective wars. We need to stop U.S. drone
3 assassinations. We need to stop U.S. payments to dictators. I
4 mean, we're subsidizing the Saudi military, and the Saudi -
5 Saudis are the ones who created ISIS, and CIA has been training
6 ISIS. CIA has also been training Uighurs from China and
7 Chechens from Russia in terrorism to send back to Russia and
8 China. That's an act of war. That's insane, it's criminally
9 insane.

10 So, I think, to be very, very positive here, the fact that
11 you're listening to me, the fact that these ideas are starting
12 to bubble up, I think that we can save the planet, and I think
13 that we can save humanity.

14 And, I think that Donald Trump is part of the tipping
15 point. You know, I mean, there are a lot of people that don't
16 like him, especially the rabid left, but - which has been
17 poisoned.

18 MURPHY: God, yeah.

19 STEELE: But, but, the reality, the reality is, is if you
20 believe that the enemy of my enemy is my friend, and if you
21 believe that the Deep State is our common enemy, then Donald
22 Trump has enormous potential, particularly, if he and Putin have
23 a Reykjavik moment in Hamburg in July. Putin has invited Trump
24 to have a private meeting in Hamburg before the G20, and I'm
25 doing what I can to support that, because if Putin -

26 The will of Alfred Nobel - I'm just back from Norway - I
27 was recommended for the Nobel Peace Prize, and I was just back
28 from Norway, where I said, among other things, I don't deserve
29 it, and my ideas don't deserve it. But, if my ideas were
30 implemented by Putin and Trump together, they would deserve it,
31 OK? And, I'd be happy to just be part of the, the, the

1 structure that creates it. Trump and Putin have the power to
2 declare peace, and they have a power, they have the power to put
3 a stop to all elective wars to all dictators.

4 We can give - there are roughly 40 dictators on this
5 planet, OK? We can give all dictators a very benign exit
6 strategy over a five-year period. And, we can, in fact, create
7 vibrant, prosperous democracy everywhere. All it takes is one
8 major power having integrity. I'm certainly not expecting this
9 from the United Kingdom, but I do believe -

10 And, and I want to say something nice about Lynn
11 Rothschild. She, she sponsored a conference on inclusive
12 capitalism. For less than one percent of what the Rothschilds
13 have under management, they could create a prosperous world at
14 peace and win the Nobel Peace Prize. But Evelyn Rothschild
15 evidently knows who I am, but he hasn't reached out to me yet.
16 I would love to see Rothschild go to his grave with the Nobel
17 Peace Prize.

18 MURPHY: Wouldn't that be something?

19 STEELE: Every person can be saved, and I think that
20 Rothschild is simply living out something that his ancestors set
21 in motion hundreds of years ago. And he and his children have
22 not made the moral and intellectual leap to being stewards of
23 the earth. They still think they're for the privileged elite,
24 and that we're all farm animals, and -

25 MURPHY: Yeah, it's, it's the problem that we have
26 everywhere of these lazy, legacy programs that just, people
27 keep, just keep running them like an old broken record over and
28 over without stopping to think, hang on a minute, is this
29 actually - does this make any sense whatsoever?

30 STEELE: Right.

1 MURPHY: And, and, look, I know that you, you had time
2 constraints, so I don't want to keep you longer than you need to
3 be here.

4 STEELE: Yeah, we should wrap up in, I'd say, five or six
5 minutes.

6 MURPHY: OK, beautiful, beautiful. Well, can I get you to
7 make some comments then on, on the 9/11 situation, because a lot
8 of people think 9/11's still quite relevant, and, and, you
9 know, obviously, it's very controversial, obvious to me, it's an
10 inside job. What do you have to say about it?

11 STEELE: Well, I have published at phibetaiota.net, if
12 people will just go there and, and search for 9/11, they'll find
13 everything we've published. And, out of our 20,000 posts, I
14 suspect we've got at least 100 on, on 9/11.

15 It is known that 13 countries warned us in advance. It is
16 known that the Israelis started planning 9/11 in 1988.

17 MURPHY: Wow.

18 STEELE: OK, it is known that once Dick Cheney heard from
19 these 13 countries, he swore them all to secrecy. He didn't
20 want the public warned about 9/11, and he scheduled a national
21 counterterrorism exercise months in advance for the day of 9/11.
22 The FEMA - the dogs were taken out of the buildings weeks or two
23 weeks prior to 9/11, and there's ample evidence of controlled
24 demolitions being put in.

25 A missile hit the Pentagon, not an airplane. The AIG
26 offices were preconfigured with explosives for the theatric
27 effect. The buildings were probably hit by specially
28 constructed drones made up to look like airplanes. Because when
29 an airplane hits a building that has steel beams every fourteen
30 inches, generally, what happens is the pilot's compartment

1 collapses into it, and then the wings catch, and the engines,
2 which have titanium parts, drop to the ground, OK?

3 So, airplanes did not hit the towers in, in 9/11, and, in
4 fact, some of the media people who had the narrative ahead of
5 time jumped the gun on timing.

6 I believe that 9/11 is the ultimate crime against humanity.
7 It led to a five trillion dollar war in the Middle East. For
8 that amount of money, I could have given everyone on the planet
9 a house with clean running water and free electricity. And, I
10 believe that, before he dies, Dick Cheney will be held
11 accountable in a truth and reconciliation sort of way for not
12 only allowing 9/11 to happen, but for actually taking it over
13 and making it happen to his specifications.

14 MURPHY: Yeah.

15 STEELE: All right, Larry Silverstein had an asbestos
16 problem he could not afford to fix. Dick Cheney solved that
17 problem for him, and I'm quite certain that the insurance
18 companies were involved. This was insurance fraud at a massive
19 scale, because any insurance company that was honest would have
20 insisted that the whole place be treated as a crime scene and
21 would have collected the evidence, and so forth.

22 Instead, you have the Israelis deepening the channel for a
23 year ahead of 9/11 so that big ships could come in to carry out
24 all the molten metal. I mean, the amount of forethought put in
25 by Israel and Cheney on 9/11 is, is nothing short of
26 astonishing.

27 So, 9/11, as with John F. Kennedy, as with false flags such
28 as the Paris false flag, the Orlando false flag, these are all
29 part of the public's awakening. And, I've said on the record
30 that John Brennan deserves the credit. The Director of CIA, by
31 overplaying his hand and telling so many lies about the Russians

1 hacking the election, managed, together with his complicit media
2 partners, to destroy the faith of the American public in both
3 secret intelligence and the fake news media.

4 What hasn't happened yet - and I need Donald Trump to do
5 this - what hasn't happened yet is the third leg of the stool,
6 which is the two-party tyranny. If we can take down the two-
7 party tyranny and restore integrity to the U.S. government, then
8 all things are possible.

9 MURPHY: Brilliant, I love it, I love it that we, we can
10 actually talk about this stuff, and that it is - that you're
11 making it sound very, very real and doable and tangible to
12 people. And, I know that that's, that's got to be reassuring
13 for a lot of people because the situation, especially in
14 Australia, in a little way, looks so hopeless and so dire and so
15 beyond repair, but you're not - you're saying that we can do
16 this thing.

17 STEELE: Listen, I love Australia, I mean, I really do.
18 I've been there in 1994 and 1998. I gave an open source
19 conference. I was funded by the government to do an open source
20 intelligence conference. I think Australia could be a land of
21 plenty, you know.

22 I would love to be invited to Australia to lecture on how
23 to create an open source engineering innovation center that
24 provides every Australian with free energy, free water, and free
25 cellular communications with access to the Internet. And, I
26 would immediately ensure that the same is done for Indonesia.

27 I'd get the Sultan of Brunei excited about creating a
28 Muslim engineering solution for the world. I'd get the Sultan
29 of Brunei and Indonesia and Australia to work with Modi and
30 India. You've got a lot of smart people in India. I want the
31 smart people in India to stop coming to The United States to

1 work for Bill Gates. I want them to stay in India and create an
2 open source everything engineering miracle. There is absolutely
3 no reason why every human being on the planet cannot have
4 pressed brick construction, running water, clean water, free
5 energy, free education.

6 The one unlimited resource we have on this planet is the
7 human brain, and there are five billion human brains that are
8 not being brought up to their full potential right now because
9 the Rothschilds and their ilk are keeping those five billion
10 people in poverty for very bad reasons. I know how to save
11 humanity. I just can't get anyone to listen to me.

12 MURPHY: The problem of the Ages there Robert.

13 STEELE: Well, if anyone knows Donald Trump, please tell
14 him I live forty minutes from the White House.

15 MURPHY: OK, well, if I can get a word in there, I'll let
16 him know. That's probably not going to happen, but we'll see
17 what we can do maybe. We're definitely behind you there, and
18 we'll get the word out a little bit more. It's been a great,
19 great chat, and I really appreciate you, your being here, and
20 our viewers will, too, when they see this, I know that.

21 STEELE: Well, I'd love to be invited to Australia and New
22 Zealand.

23 MURPHY: I'll invite you, I'll invite you right now. Come
24 over, we'll.

25 STEELE: Yeh, except it requires a business-class ticket
26 and a donation to the, to the nonprofit, but, but I would like
27 to -

28 I, I really think, see, Indonesia, Indonesia is, is, I
29 think, the largest Muslim country on the planet. India is
30 actually the second largest. India has more Muslims than all
31 other countries, less Indonesia, OK?

1 MURPHY: Wow.

2 STEELE: I believe that the Sultan of Brunei is a very
3 smart, well-intentioned guy, and Australia hasn't, Australia
4 hasn't really thought through, how do you work with the Sultan
5 of Brunei and Indonesia to create a triangle of prosperity that
6 is sustainable. And, that includes working with China so they
7 stop stealing the lumber from Indonesia, OK, and other things.
8 That includes Papua New Guinea doing some things better, because
9 there's a lot of crime going on there now.

10 So, bottom line for me, is - Australia, God love them, is
11 one of the last places where English is still the national
12 language, and you really do have enormous potential. And, I
13 think your, your government has enormous potential. It's time
14 they get a divorce from the Americans and start thinking for
15 themselves.

16 MURPHY: So, guys, that was our interview with Robert David
17 Steele, ex-CIA agent. Many thanks to Robert for taking the time
18 to talk to us. His website, where you can find his interviews,
