Sir (Horatio) Gilbert George Parker, 1st Bt (1860-1932), Novelist and Conservative politician; MP for Gravesend

Sitter in 17 portraits

Canadian-born Gilbert Parker began his career as a teacher in Ontario. After several years travelling he moved to Britain and began writing. His first book, *Pierre and his People: Tales of the Far North*, was published in 1892. Many novels followed, the most successful of which was *The Seats of the Mighty* (1896), a story based on the British capture of Quebec. A strong belief in Imperialism led Parker to stand as an MP. He was elected to Parliament in 1900, where he actively promoted colonial interests. Parker played a significant role in British propaganda during World War I, being responsible for all British propaganda in America. He was rewarded for this service with a baronetcy.






