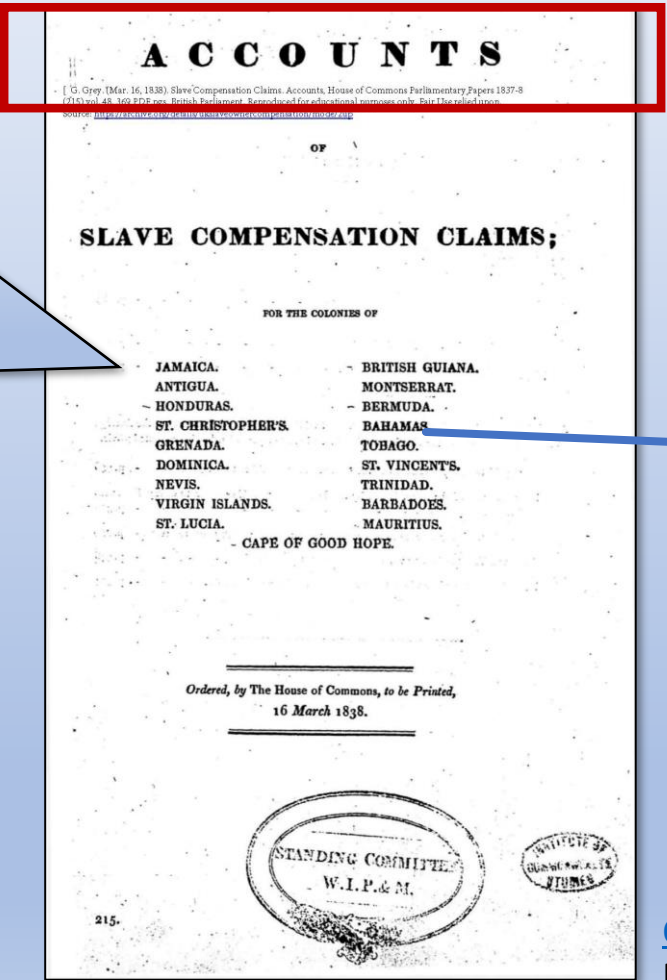

On Aug. 03, 1835, Parliament agreed to a £15 million loan from Rothschild & Co. (N.M. Rothschild) to fund the compensation of the “proprietors” in the slaver colonies for the slaves they were giving up. Earlier, ca. 1815, Rothschild had loaned the British Army £9.8 million (\$1.1 billion today) to attack America (including occupying the White House) in the War of 1812.
