This Turkey opium was due to the enterprise of some American captains. The first of these was a Captain Dobell of the Philadelphia brig Sylph. He arrived at Macao on July 22, 1811, with a cargo of opium from Smyrna; and his speculation was so successful that other ships were soon loading the drug at Smyrna. One of these, the President Adams of Boston, with 170,000 dollars in specie and a quantity of Turkish opium on board, came to grief on St. John's Island to the Westward of Macao on October 6, 1813. This was unfortunate, for the war with Great Britain was already checking the American effort to run Turkish opium into China. The news of the outbreak of hostilities between Britain and America was not known in Canton until February 5, 1813, when the Ann of Baltimore arrived in the Pearl River with a copy of the declaration of war. After the war the Smyrna trade continued in the hands of the Americans.

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The other clipper was a Boston brigantine, which was sent out by Captain Forbes.

Forbes sends out the Brigantine "Rose."

The 150-ton clipper brigantine Rose was designed by Joe Lee and built by Barney at Swansea, R.I., to the order of Captain

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Rose Green Smith, whom he had married in 1834. He loaded her pretty deep with flour and sent her out to China by way of Callao under Captain B. T. Foster.

She had very bad weather and poor trades to start with, was 23 days to the Line after leaving Boston in November, 1836; made the land about Cape St. Thomas on Christmas Day, 37 days out; was in 34° S., 51° W. on January 1, 1837, made the Falklands 55 days out on January 12, entered Magellan Straits on January 15 and anchored in Freshwater Bay. She was a week getting through the Straits according to Forbes and reached Callao on February 13, 86 days from Boston. From Callao she touched at the Sandwich Islands and anchored off Lintin on April 25, 66 days from Callao, having had light winds all the way across the Pacific. Her captain was loud in her praises and pronounced her to be the "neatest craft" in the opium fleet.

Forbes had instructions to buy all the Turkey opium he could without unsteadying the market. His agent was Mr. Joseph Langdon, the principal American merchant in Turkey. The pair of them decided that after buying as much opium as possible with the proceeds of the coffee and the dollars, Forbes should sail for Gibraltar and "await operations on a larger scale."

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had just been bought by his uncle for the China trade. After receiving several other shipments of opium, the Bashaw, a full-rigged ship of 390 tons, sailed on July 10.

The Leander had opium on board and it was important that her captain should not suspect that Forbes also carried the drug. However,

Both he and his super-cargo at once tried to find out the truth, but Forbes had given strict orders to his crew to let out nothing.



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& Co., Canton, and also American Consul. The Bashaw and the Leander were the only ships bringing Turkey opium, and the total amount from Smyrna was not more than 1000 chests. Forbes, who had seen very little of his elder brother Thomas, was glad of a five months' stay with him, and he little knew that when he sailed from China in April, 1829, that was the last he was to see of this brother.

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

With the arrival of Augustine Heard in the Lintin the old American house of Samuel Russell & Co., known in Canton as the Kee-Chang Hong, was reorganised. Founded by Samuel Russell as far back as December, 1818, up till the middle of 1830 the only partners had been Samuel Russell and Philip Ammidon. It was now reorganised, William H. Low, who had arrived out in the ship Sumatra in the previous September, and Augustine Heard becoming partners, whilst young John Forbes joined the staff. At this date Russell & Co. were purely an agency, they owned no ships and they did no trade on their own account, but they were lucky in having much of the business of Baring Bros. and also that of Houqua. Besides this, with two such go-ahead sailors as Augustine Heard and R. B. Forbes interested in the firm, from this date it went ahead by leaps and bounds.

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Five opium clippers were entered as making two trips in the year between Calcutta and Lintin. These were Jamesina, Falcon, Red Rover, Waterwitch and Sylph.

Amongst the store and receiving ships lying at the outer anchorages were Dent's *Jane* and *Charles Forbes*; Jardine Matheson's *Hercules*, and Russell's *Lintin*.



It was jokingly said in the family that if it had not been for the dilatory expressman Mr. Sturgis would never have become head of the firm of Baring Bros. & Co. He never returned to this country, dying in England in 1887.

- 5. Benjamin Moran, at the American Legation, noted with approval a speech that Baring made in the House of Commons in May 1864: The man is a gentleman...It is mortifying to me that while he is loyal to us, the only citizen of the United States belonging to his firm, **Mr Russell Sturgis, is a rebel sympathizer**.' Sturgis was indeed a considerable embarrassment to his colleagues.


For a glimpse into just how cozy the relationship was between Biddle and Barings see "The House of Baring and the Second Bank of the United States, 1826-1836" by R. W. Hidy in The Pennsylvania Magazine of History and Biography, Vol. 68, No. 3 (Jul., 1944), pp. 269-285. Barings could easily have let the USA crash any number of times because Biddle went way over the overdraft the USA had with Barings a few times without agreement, and asked for huge credit when the USA was facing financial trouble. This annoyed Barings but they acquiesced and in the end made a huge profit from doing so.





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Then in January, 1827, the American brig Nile, commanded by Robert Bennet Forbes, went up the coast with George Beale, Thomas Dent and a quantity of opium on board. This was probably the first trip made up the coast by an American vessel. Forbes went as far as Amoy but no merchants dared to come off to the stranger, and after waiting about for several days Captain Forbes, in accordance with the orders from his owner, Mr. Cushing, sailed back to Lintin, much against the wishes of Beale, who was confident that only patience was needed to start a trade.

Robert Bennet Forbes was a young captain, barely 23 years of age, the employee of his uncles, the brothers J. & T. H. Perkins. We shall hear a great deal more of him later on, for he was head partner of Russell & Co. for several years and directly responsible for practically all the American clippers in the opium trade.



Colonel Thomas Handasyd Perkins, also known as T. H. Perkins (December 15, 1764 – January 11, 1854), was an American merchant, slave trader, smuggler and philanthropist from a wealthy **Boston Brahmin** family. Starting with bequests from his grandfather and father-in-law, he amassed a huge fortune. As a young man, he **traded slaves** in **Saint-Domingue**, worked as a **maritime fur trader** trading furs **from the American Northwest to China**, and then turned to smuggling **Turkish opium** into China. [2] [3] His philanthropic contributions include the **Perkins School for the Blind**, renamed in his honor; the **Boston Museum of Fine Arts**; **McLean Hospital**; along with having a hand in founding the **Massachusetts General Hospital**.

In 1785, when China opened the port of **Canton** to foreign businesses, Perkins became one of the first Boston merchants to engage in the **China trade**. He sailed as **supercargo** on the *Astrea*, captain **James Magee**, owned by **Elias Hasket Derby**, **[6]** to Canton in 1789 with a cargo including ginseng, cheese, lard, wine, and iron. On the trip back it carried tea and silk cloth. [7] In 1815, Perkins and his brother James opened a Mediterranean office to buy Turkish opium for resale in China. [5]

The 150-ton clipper brigantine Rose was designed by Joe Lee and built by Barney at Swansea, R.I., to the order of Captain





Rose Green Smith, whom he had married in 1834. He loaded her pretty deep with flour and sent her out to China by way of Callao under Captain B. T. Foster.

She had very bad weather and poor trades to start with, was 23 days to the Line after leaving Boston in November, 1836; made the land about Cape St. Thomas on Christmas Day, 37 days out; was in 34° S., 51° W. on January 1, 1837, made the Falklands 55 days out on January 12, entered Magellan Straits on January 15 and anchored in Freshwater Bay. She was a week getting through the Straits according to Forbes and reached Callao on February 13, 86 days from Boston. From Callao she touched at the Sandwich Islands and anchored off Lintin on April 25, 66 days from Callao, having had light winds all the way across the Pacific. Her captain was loud in her praises and pronounced her to be the "neatest craft" in the opium fleet.

Forbes had instructions to buy all the Turkey opium he could without unsteadying the market. His agent was Mr. Joseph Langdon, the principal American merchant in Turkey. The pair of them decided that after buying as much opium as possible with the proceeds of the coffee and the dollars, Forbes should sail for Gibraltar and "await operations on a larger scale."

had just been bought by his uncle for the China trade. After receiving several other shipments of opium, the Bashaw, a full-rigged ship of 390 tons, sailed on July 10.

Forbes arrived in the Straits of Sunda in October. At Anjer he fell in with the brig *Leander* of Salem, belonging to Joseph Peabody, which he had met leaving Smyrna, when in the *Danube*.

The Leander had opium on board and it was important that her captain should not suspect that Forbes also carried the drug. However,

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Forbes was not a man one could forget, and directly the *Leander's* captain came aboard he recognised the late skipper of the *Danube*. Both he and his super-cargo at once tried to find out the truth, but Forbes had given strict orders to his crew to let out nothing.

John R. Russell

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American house of Samuel Russell & Co., known in Canton as the Kee-Chang Hong, was reorganised. Founded by Samuel Russell as far back as December, 1818, up till the middle of 1830 the only partners had been Samuel Russell and Philip Ammidon. It was now reorganised, William H. Low, who had arrived out in the ship Sumatra in the previous September, and Augustine Heard becoming partners, whilst young John Forbes joined the staff. At this date Russell & Co. were purely an agency, they owned no ships and they did no trade on their own account, but they were lucky in having much of the business of Baring Bros. and also that of Houqua. Besides this, with two such go-ahead sailors as Augustine Heard and R. B. Forbes interested in the firm, from this date it went ahead by leaps and bounds.

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Five opium clippers were entered as making two trips in the year between Calcutta and Lintin. These were Jamesina, Falcon, Red Rover, Waterwitch and Sylph.

Amongst the store and receiving ships lying at the outer anchorages were Dent's Jane and Charles Forbes; Jardine Matheson's Hercules, and Russell's Lintin.

Forbes went as far as Amoy but no merchants dared to come off to the stranger, and after waiting about for several days Captain Forbes, in accordance with the orders from his owner, Mr. Cushing, sailed back to Lintin, much against the wishes of Beale, who was confident that only patience was needed to start a trade.
